By decision and notice of interim trail use or abandonment (NITU) served on March 29, 1996, a 180-day period was authorized for the County of Sutter, CA (the County), to negotiate an interim trail use/rail banking agreement with the Union Pacific Railroad Company (UP) for a 5.20-mile portion of the Yuba City Branch line between milepost 0.00 near Colusa Jct. and the end of the line at milepost 5.20 near Sutter, in Sutter County, CA. Subsequently, the negotiation period under the NITU was extended by decisions served on September 19, 1996, December 20, 1996, and July 1, 1997. The last extension is scheduled to expire on December 19, 1997.

By letter filed December 11, 1997, the County seeks to extend the NITU negotiation period for an additional 90 days. County states that more time is needed to continue and complete negotiations. By letter filed December 17, 1997, UP consents to the extension.

Because an extension of the negotiation period will promote the establishment of trail use and rail banking consistent with the National Trails System Act, 16 U.S.C. 1247(d), and the parties agree on the necessity for the extension, the request will be granted. See Policy Statement on Rails to Trails Conversions, Ex Parte No. 274 (Sub-No. 13B) (ICC served Feb. 5, 1990). Accordingly, the NITU negotiation period will be extended until March 19, 1998.

This action will not significantly affect either the quality of the human environment or the conservation of energy resources.
