NORFOLK SOUTHERN RAILWAY COMPANY—ABANDONMENT EXEMPTION—IN
GRANT COUNTY, IN

Decided: February 26, 2010

By decision and notice of interim trail use or abandonment (NITU) served on January 28, 2008, a 180-day period was authorized for the City of Marion, IN, and Greenways Foundation, Inc. (together, proponents), to negotiate an interim trail use/rail banking agreement with Norfolk Southern Railway Company (NSR) for 3.66 miles of rail line between mileposts TS 153.35 and TS 157.01 at Marion, in Grant County, IN. The negotiating period under the NITU was extended by three decisions, with the latest extension expiring on February 16, 2010.

By letter filed on February 16, 2010, proponents have requested another 180-day extension of the NITU negotiating period. Proponents state that the parties remain engaged in discussions toward an agreement for the acquisition and interim trail use of the line. On February 22, 2010, NSR filed a response consenting to the extension request

Where, as here, the carrier has not consummated the abandonment at the end of the previously imposed negotiating period and agrees to continue negotiations, the Board retains jurisdiction and the NITU negotiating period may be extended.¹ Under the circumstances, extension of the negotiating period is warranted. See Birt v. STB, 90 F.3d 580, 588-90 (D.C. Cir. 1996); Grantwood Village v. Missouri Pac. R.R. Co., 95 F.3d 654, 659 (8th Cir. 1996). Accordingly, the NITU negotiating period will be extended until August 15, 2010.

This decision will not significantly affect either the quality of the human environment or the conservation of energy resources.

It is ordered:

1. Proponents' request to extend the NITU negotiating period for 180 days is granted.
2. The negotiating period under the NITU is extended to August 15, 2010.
