R.J. CORMAN RAILROAD COMPANY/ALLENTOWN LINES, INC.–
ABANDONMENT EXEMPTION–IN LEBANON COUNTY, PA

Decided: April 10, 2003

R.J. Corman Railroad Company/Allentown Lines, Inc. (RJCN) filed a notice of exemption under 49 CFR 1152.50 to abandon: (1) the Cornwall Industrial Track between approximately milepost 0.9 and approximately milepost 3.66; and (2) the Lebanon Industrial Track between approximately milepost 18 and approximately milepost 18.6, a distance of approximately 3.36 miles, in Lebanon County, PA.¹ On October 16, 2001, a decision and notice of interim trail use or abandonment (NITU) was served authorizing a 180-day period for Lebanon Valley Rails-to-Trails (LVRT) to negotiate an interim trail use/rail banking agreement with RJCN for the right-of-way involved in this proceeding. The 180-day period under the NITU was extended by decisions served April 11, 2002, and October 10, 2002. The latest extension is scheduled to expire on April 10, 2003.

On April 4, 2003, LVRT filed a request for an additional 180-day extension of the negotiating period so that the remaining title searches and final negotiations with RJCN can be completed. In a response submitted by facsimile on April 8, 2003, RJCN advised the Board that it supports the extension request.

Where, as here, the carrier is willing to continue trail use negotiations, the negotiating period may be extended.² An extension of the negotiating period will promote the establishment of trails and rail banking consistent with the National Trails System Act, 16 U.S.C. 1247(d). Accordingly, the negotiating period will be extended to October 8, 2003.
