BNSF RAILWAY COMPANY—ABANDONMENT EXEMPTION—IN SWIFT
COUNTY, MN

Decided: March 24, 2008

BNSF Railway Company (BNSF) filed a notice of exemption under 49 CFR 1152 Subpart F—Exempt Abandonments to abandon a rail line between Engineering Stations 0 + 00 and 28 + 61, near Appleton, in Swift County, MN, a distance of 0.54 miles. Notice of the exemption was served and published in the Federal Register on April 4, 2007 (72 FR 16409). The exemption became effective on May 4, 2007.¹

In the April 4, 2007 notice, the Board stated that, if consummation had not been effected by BNSF's filing of a notice of consummation by April 4, 2008, and there were no legal or regulatory barriers to consummation, the authority to abandon would automatically expire. Under 49 CFR 1152.29(e)(2), a railroad may, for good cause, file a request for an extension of time to file a notice of consummation in abandonment proceedings.

On March 6, 2008, BNSF filed a request to extend, until April 3, 2009, the time to consummate the abandonment. In support, BNSF states that bridge ownership issues and winter weather conditions have delayed salvage of the line. BNSF has shown good cause to extend the time to consummate the abandonment and for filing a notice of consummation in this proceeding. Accordingly, the request will be granted.

This action will not significantly affect either the quality of the human environment or the conservation of energy resources.

It is ordered:

1. BNSF's request for an extension of time to consummate the abandonment is granted.
2. The authority to abandon must be exercised, and the notice of consummation must be filed, on or before April 3, 2009.

¹ By decision served on May 3, 2007, the proceeding was reopened at the request of the Board's Section of Environmental Analysis and the exemption was made subject to four environmental conditions, which remain in effect.

3. This decision is effective on its date of service.
