Dear Ms. Dean,

This email is in response to your questions regarding the recently filed Abandonment Exemption of a portion of the Yakima Industrial Lead from MP 57.3 to 58.75 near Grandview in Yakima County Washington (STB Docket No. AB-33). Union Pacific's rail line planning expert Mr. Ray Allamong and attorney Mr. Mack Shumate are unavailable this week to review responses to these questions, so my responses below are in order to provide you with short term assistance only, and are provisional in nature pending their review.

- (1) Map of area - attached are 2 satellite images of the area which reveal the bridge in question
- (2) Bridge cross - the bridge does not appear to cross a waterway; it appears to cross a BNSF rail line.
- (3) Salvage plans - UP Engineering was unaware of specific plans to salvage or tear down the bridge at this time. I understand the process would be to check if the community wants it or tear down if there is no filing, however that will have to be confirmed with Mr. Allamong.
- (4) Community - the area community appears to be Grandview, Washington

I hope this is helpful and I will certainly follow up with Ray Allamong should he call in this week. If not, I will ask him to review my response on his return and supply you with any necessary corrections.
