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

On January 26, 2015, I sent a letter to you asking a couple of questions regarding the Bailey Branch in the above referenced Docket Number. A copy of that letter is enclosed. Please be advised that while no formal response was received by the STB, informal communications did occur and Benton County obtained the information it needed to assess options involving its ownership of the Bailey Branch.

Because Benton County has received sufficient information to the questions posed in its Jan. 26 letter, there is no need for the STB to formally respond to that letter. Accordingly, this letter will serve as notice to the STB that no further action or information from STB is necessary.

Benton County understands, and fully expects, that no change has occurred in the rail bank status of the Bailey Branch. If there are issues or concerns that arise in the future about the Bailey Branch or its rail bank status, please inform us immediately.

If you have any questions or concerns about this letter, the Bailey Branch or anything else relating to Benton County's ownership of that rail line, please feel free to contact me at your convenience.

Dear Ms. Brown

In 2014, Benton County, Oregon purchased the above-reference rail line ("Bailey Branch") from Union Pacific. The Bailey Branch is current rail banked.

The Bailey Branch has generated a great deal of interest, which has spurred conversations regarding creative uses for the rail line. In order to properly explore any options, Benton County would like confirmation of a couple of rail bank issues.

1. If Benton County conveys one small length of track to a municipality and a second small segment to an owner of an historic lumber mill, subject to the rail banking status, do such conveyances ensure the conveyed stretches of rail line will remain in the rail bank program? One of the lengths of track is located at the southern terminus of the Bailey Branch. The other length is located at the tail end of a spur line.
2. If Benton County conveys all of the Bailey Branch except the previously described two small sections, to a single entity, again, subject to the conveyed rail line remaining in the rail bank program, does this larger conveyance ensure the continued rail bank status of the Bailey Branch?

After reading 49 C.F.R. part 1152.29(t), it appears the above-described transactions are permitted and will not, in and of themselves, terminate the rail bank status of the Bailey Branch. However, Benton County would like confirmation that its reading of the C.F.R. is correct.
