

Dear Ms. Brown:

Union Pacific Railroad Company ("Union Pacific") has received a request from the City of Lexington, Missouri ("City") dated August 5, 2014 seeking a 180-day extension of the negotiation period for interim trail use and rail banking under the provisions of 16 U.S.C. §1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. § 1152.29 regarding that portion of the Union Pacific's right-of-way known as the Lexington Industrial Lead, as defined above, a distance of 2.91 miles in Lafayette County, Missouri. The current negotiation period is scheduled to expire on August 12, 2014.

The Union Pacific is willing to continue to negotiate with the City concerning the acquisition of the subject property for trail use and supports the City's request for a 180-day extension of the negotiation period to February 8, 2015. A copy of the City's request is attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and hereby made a part hereof.


Dear Ms. Brown:

Under the above described Decision and the Notice of Interim Trail Use (NITU), an extension of time for negotiation of our trail use/rail banking agreement was granted February 13, 2014, and the permit for public use negotiations was granted until August 12, 2014.
