For convenience, this disk also contains the text of the Notice of Exemption.





Filing Fee Waiver Request

Dear Ms. Brown:

Enclosed in the above-captioned proceeding is a request for a waiver of fees regarding the filing of the enclosed Joint Verified Notice of Exemption for Claremont Concord Railroad Corporation (“CCRC”) and the State of New Hampshire (“the State”), to discontinue service and abandon approximately a 0.97 mile segment of rail line beginning at Railroad Milepost B140, Station 3515+69 on map v32.1-68 and ending at Railroad Milepost B141, Station 3568+49 on map v32.1-69 which traverses through United States Postal Service ZIP Code 03766 in Lebanon, Grafton County, New Hampshire. (Exhibit A).

This request for the filing fee waiver is being made as it is in the public’s best interest. A waiver in the filing fee will conserve some of the funds set aside for the Mascoma Greenway Project, so they may be used in the actual creation and maintenance of the trail corridor, as opposed to this initial phase to abandon the railroad corridor. The filing fee funds could instead be used to facilitate an efficient and timely transition from the railroad corridor to a public trail use by enabling the purchase of the design and materials to enclose the bridge located within the section to be abandoned so as to make it safe for pedestrian access. Also, the funds could be

used to pay for the equipment to remove the track, ties and other railroad materials, prior to allowing its use as a public trail. Waiving the filing fee will greatly assist the public use of this corridor and facilitate a more timely maintenance schedule, given that the funds would be available immediately, as opposed to seeking donor contributions after the filing, which may take time to acquire.

As a result, it is in the public's best interest that the Surface Transportation Board grant this request to waive the filing fee associated with this Joint Notice of Discontinuance of Service and Abandonment.



DISCONTINUANCE**

Pursuant to 49 U.S.C. § 10502 and the regulations of the Surface Transportation Board ("the Board") at 49 C.F.R. §§ 1121 and 1152.50, Claremont Concord Railroad Corporation ("CCRC") and the State of New Hampshire ("the State") hereby jointly submit this Discontinuance of Service and Verified Notice of Exemption for Abandonment. CCRC and the State submit this Verified Notice of Exemption to the Board for an exemption from the prior approval requirements of 49 U.S.C. § 10903 for CCRC to discontinue its rail common carrier obligation over the line of railroad ("the Line") and to allow the State to abandon the Line beginning at Railroad Milepost B140, Station 3515+69 on map v32.1-68 and ending at Railroad Milepost B141, Station 3568+49 on map v32.1-69 in Lebanon, Grafton County, New Hampshire, a distance of approximately 0.97 miles. A map showing the location of the line to be

abandoned is attached to this Notice as Exhibit B. A draft Federal Register notice in the form prescribed by 49 C.F.R. § 1152.60(c) is attached hereto as Appendix D.

CCRC intends to file its discontinuance exemption and the State intends to file its verified notice of abandonment exemption with the Board on or about December 17, 2014. CCRC and the State hereby invoke the Board's two-year-out-of-service class exemption procedures. After abandonment, the railbed and subgrade of the Line will remain in place and not be disturbed, but the rails, ties and other track material will be removed and salvaged. The Line proposed to be abandoned is appropriate for use for other public purposes, including recreation. The State has agreed to undertake the subject abandonment as a means to permit the section of the Line to be used as a rail trail under the Board's interim trails use processes. In accordance with the requirements of 49 C.F.R. §1152.50(d)(2), CCRC and the State submit the following information:

CERTIFICATION: 49 C.F.R. § 1152.50(B)

CCRC and the State jointly certify that the Line satisfies the criteria for abandonment under the exemption provisions at 49 C.F.R. part 1152, subpart F. See Certification of Chris Freed, President of CCRC (Exhibit B). See also, Certification of Jeff Brillhart, Acting Commissioner at New Hampshire Department of Transportation (Exhibit B).

CCRC currently leases the subject Line from the State. CCRC is seeking to invoke the discontinuance of service class exemption procedures to be relieved of its common carrier obligations over the Line. CCRC hereby certify that the Line satisfies the criteria for its discontinuance of common carrier service under the class exemption procedures, because, during

the past two years, CCRC has provided no local or overhead common carrier service over the Line, nor has CCRC or the State received any requests for common carrier service over the Line.

The State, as owner of the Line, concurs in CCRC's decision to terminate its leasehold interest in the Line and to discontinue CCRC's common carrier status over it. Given the long-standing inactivity and absence of traffic on the Line, the State has elected concurrently with CCRC's discontinuance notice to invoke the Board's class exemption procedures to abandon the Line, rather than to assume primary responsibility to provide common carrier service over it following CCRC's proposed discontinuance.

PROPOSED CONSUMMATION DATE: 49 C.F.R. § 1152.50(d)(2)

CCRC and the State propose that the consummation date for discontinuance of service and abandonment of the Line will both be consummated no sooner than 50 days after the Board's acceptance of this joint notice of exemption filing.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REQUIRED: 49 C.F.R. §§ 1152.22(A)(1)-(4), (7)-(8) AND (E)(4)

CCRC is a common carrier by railroad, subject to 49 U.S.C. Subtitle IV Ch. 105 and the Board's jurisdiction. CCRC is independently owned and is a common carrier by railroad, subject to 49 U.S.C. DESCRIPTION OF LINE TO BE ABANDONED

CCRC and the State jointly seek to discontinue service and abandon the railroad line that extends a total distance of approximately 0.97 miles. The Line is located beginning at Railroad Milepost B140, Station 3515+69 on map v32.1-68 and ending at Railroad Milepost B141, Station 3568+49 on map v32.1-69 which traverses through United States Postal Service ZIP Code 03766 in Lebanon, Grafton County, New Hampshire. See Exhibit B for the Map showing the Line to be abandoned.

Pursuant to 49 C.F.R. § 1152.60(d), the State and CCRC state that, based on information in their possession, the Line does not contain any federally granted rights-of-way. Any documentation in their possession will be made available promptly to those requesting it. Additionally, the State and CCRC are not aware of any restriction on the title to the property, including any reversionary interest, which would affect the transfer of title or the use of the property for other than rail purposes, other than an easement granted July 29, 1986 by Boston & Maine to AT&T for and to maintain an underground fiber optic cable within the line segment to be abandoned.

JURISDICTION AND STATUTORY STANDARDS

The Board has jurisdiction over the proposed discontinuance of service by CCRC and abandonment of the Line by the State pursuant to 49 U.S.C. § 10903. Generally, a common carrier by rail must obtain authority from the Board under § 10903 before discontinuing service and abandoning a line of railroad. However, 49 U.S.C. § 10502 requires the Board to exempt a person, transaction or service from the statutory and regulatory requirements otherwise

applicable to a rail carrier when the Board determines that: (1) application of those requirements is not necessary to carry out the rail transportation policy of 49 U.S.C. § 10101; and (2) either (a) the transaction is of limited scope or (b) regulation is not needed to protect shippers from an abuse of market power. Additionally the railroad is statutorily obligated to protect the interests of employees.

A. Detailed Scrutiny Under 49 U.S.C. § 10903 Is Not Necessary To Carry Out The Rail Transportation Policy Of 49 U.S.C. § 10101

Granting the State and CCRC an exemption to discontinue service and abandon the Line is consistent with the goals articulated in the National Rail Transportation Policy, 49 U.S.C. § 10101. Additionally the proposed action is of limited scope and regulation is not necessary to protect the remaining on-Line customers from market power abuse. The statutory exemption procedure of § 10502 obviates the need for the expensive and time-consuming processes attendant to a proceeding under § 10903, including the costs of preparing an application. Therefore, CCRC and the State respectfully request that the Board grant their joint petition for discontinuance of service and abandonment. In granting the petition, none of the other rail transportation policy criteria will be adversely affected.

B. The Transaction Is Of Limited Scope

The transaction for which exemption is sought consists solely of the discontinuance of service and abandonment of a portion of the Line totaling approximately 0.97 miles on which no shippers are located. There has been no service over the Line for over twenty years. Also, there are currently no pending cases or decisions and no formal complaints have been filed by a user of the Line regarding cessation of service or alleging unlawful impediment to service. Further, any overhead traffic on the line can be rerouted over other lines. The proposed discontinuance of

service and abandonment clearly is of limited scope and the Board should grant CCRC and the State an exemption to the formal abandonment proceeding.

C. Regulation Is Not Necessary To Protect Shippers From An Abuse Of Market Power

This transaction will not and cannot subject shippers to any market power abuse. As stated, there are no shippers located on the Line that CCRC and the State seek to abandon. There also have not been any shippers for many years on this Line. Accordingly, regulation of this abandonment by the Board is not necessary to protect any shipper from an abuse of market power.

LABOR PROTECTION

Finally, CCRC and the State do not anticipate any adverse impact on employment levels as a result of the proposed discontinuance of service and abandonment as there has been no traffic over the Line in many years. Nevertheless, they agree that the appropriate level of employee protection to be imposed on this abandonment is that established in Oregon Short Line R. Co - Abandonment - Goshen, 360 I.C.C. 91 (1979).

PUBLIC PURPOSES AND/OR TRAIL USE

The Line is suitable for other public purposes or trail use. There are no known restrictions on the Title of property, including any reversionary interest which would affect transfer of title or use of the property for other than rail purposes. However, AT&T does have an easement for, and maintains, an underground fiber optic cable within the Line segment to be abandoned.

CERTIFICATIONS

Attached hereto as Exhibit **C** are Certificates of Service and Publication certifying compliance with the advance notice and newspaper publication requirements set forth at 49 C.F.R. §1152.50(d)(1) and 49 C.F.R. § 1105.12, respectively. Attached as part of Exhibit **D** is a Certificate of Compliance with the advance notice requirements for the Environmental and Historic Reports as set forth at 49 C.F.R. § 1105.11.

ENVIRONMENTAL REPORT

As is reflected in the Certificate of Compliance with the provisions of 49 C.F.R. § 1105.11 (see Exhibit **D**), CCRC's and the State's representative has prepared a combined Environmental and Historic Report in anticipation of the proposed joint discontinuance of service and abandonment of the Line, which conforms to the requirements of 49 C.F.R. §§ 1105.7 and 1105.8. A copy of the Report is attached hereto as Attachment 1 to Exhibit **D** (§ 1105.11 Certification).

WHEREFORE, CCRC respectfully requests that the Board exempt from the prior approval requirements of 49 U.S.C. § 10903 the discontinuance of service by CCRC and the abandonment by the State of the Line extending from Railroad Milepost B140 to Railroad Milepost B141 in Lebanon, Grafton County, NH.

COMBINED ENVIRONMENTAL/HISTORIC REPORT

The State of New Hampshire (“the State”) and Claremont Concord Railroad Corporation (“CCRC”) jointly submit this combined Environmental/Historic Report in compliance with the reporting requirements of 49 C.F.R. §§ 1105.7 and 1105.8. Supporting correspondence is attached. It is the conclusion of this Report that the proposed abandonment, if implemented, will not significantly affect either the quality of the human environment or the conservation of energy resources.

ENVIRONMENTAL REPORT - 49 C.F.R. § 1105.7(c)

1. Proposed Action and Alternatives

Describe the proposed action, including commodities transported, the planned disposition (if any) of any rail line and other structures that may be involved, and any possible changes in current operations or maintenance practices. Also describe any reasonable alternatives to the proposed action. Include a readable, detailed map and drawings clearly

delineating the project.

Response: CCRC and the State seek to discontinue service and abandon a line of railroad, (“the Line”), of approximately 0.97 miles beginning at Railroad Milepost B140, Station 3515+69 on map v32.1-68 and ending at Railroad Milepost B141, Station 3568+49 on map v32.1-69, which traverses through United States Postal Service ZIP Code 03766 in Lebanon, Grafton County, New Hampshire.

CCRC and the State believe that there have been no rail shipments of any kind on the Line in well over two years, and no reasonable possibility for the development of new rail traffic exists. Following abandonment and discontinuance of service the railbed and subgrade of the Line will remain in place and not be disturbed but the tracks, ties, and other track material will be salvaged. There are two bridges located along the Line and the State Historic Preservation Office within the New Hampshire Historical Society has been contacted to determine whether any historic structures will be affected by the abandonment. See correspondence attached herein.

CCRC’s and the State’s representative has contacted and requested comments from the Grafton County Board of Supervisors as well as the Mayor of Lebanon, NH.

A map delineating the Line proposed for discontinuance and abandonment is attached hereto as Appendix A. CCRC’s and the State’s representative’s letter to federal, state and local government agencies is attached as Appendix B. Responses to the letter or other comments received can be found in Appendix C.

2. Transportation System

Describe the effects of the proposed action on regional or local transportation systems and patterns. Estimate the amount of traffic (passenger or freight) that will be diverted to other transportation systems or modes as a result of the proposed action.

Response: CCRC and the State do not anticipate that existing regional or local transportation systems or patterns will be affected by the proposed discontinuance and abandonment. No rail service is currently provided on the Line. Thus, no traffic will be diverted to other transportation systems or modes as a result of the proposed discontinuance and abandonment. There is no overhead traffic on the Line, and no passenger trains are operated over the Line. The State's and CCRC's representative has contacted and requested comments from the New Hampshire Department of Transportation. See correspondence attached herein. CCRC will comply with all applicable rules and regulations when performing the discontinuance and related activities and will employ good engineering practices.

3. Land Use

(i) Based on consultation with local and/or regional planning agencies and/or a review of the official planning documents prepared by such agencies, state whether the proposed action is consistent with existing land use plans. Describe any inconsistencies.

(ii) Based on consultation with the U.S. Soil Conservation Service, state the effect of the proposed action on any prime agricultural land.

(iii) If the action affects land or water uses within a designated coastal zone, include the coastal zone information required by Sec. 1105.9.

(iv) If the proposed action is an abandonment, state whether or not the right-of-way is suitable for alternative public use under 49 U.S. C. 10906 and explain why.

Response: (i) CCRC and the State do not foresee any inconsistency with regional and/or local land use plans, but has contacted and requested comments from NOAA/National Geodetic Survey. See correspondence attached herein.

(ii) CCRC and the State believe that the proposed discontinuance and abandonment of the Line will not affect any prime or unique agricultural land. The State's representative has contacted and requested comments from the Natural Resources Conservation Service of the United States Department of Agriculture.

(iii) This track does not appear to be within a designated Coastal Zone Management Area and, accordingly, the proposed discontinuance and abandonment will not affect any land or water uses in such an area or result in any coastal impacts. The State's representative has contacted the Office of Water at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to determine whether the proposed abandonment is consistent with applicable federal, state and local water quality standards. The State's representative has also contacted its regional EPA Office. See correspondence attached herein. The rail and other salvageable materials will be removed from the Line subsequent to abandonment. CCRC and the State will follow all rules and regulations for the removal of such materials. The railbed will remain in place, and no re-grading will be done.

(iv) The right-of-way of the Line is suitable for an alternative public use under 49 U.S.C. § 10905 as a trail and the State will work to reach a trail use agreement that complies with the National Trails System Act, 16 U.S.C. § 1247(d).

4. Energy

- (i) Describe the effect of the proposed action on transportation of energy resources.*
- (ii) Describe the effect of the proposed action on recyclable commodities.*
- (iii) State whether the proposed action will result in an increase or decrease in overall energy efficiency and explain why.*
- (iv) If the proposed action will cause diversions from rail to motor carriage of more than:
 - (A) 1,000 rail carloads a year; or*
 - (B) An average of 50 rail carloads per mile per year for any part of the affected line, quantify the resulting net change in energy consumption and show the data and methodology used to arrive at the figure given.**

Response: (i) The proposed abandonment will not have any effect on the transportation of energy resources. No energy resource commodities move on the Line and CCRC and the State foresee little or no possibility that such on-line traffic would develop in the future.

(ii) The movement and/or recovery of recyclable commodities will not be adversely

affected by this discontinuance and abandonment. No recyclable commodities move over the Line and CCRC and the State foresee little possibility that any on-line recyclable commodity traffic would develop in the future.

(iii) Abandonment will not result in an increase or decrease in overall energy efficiency. There is no freight traffic on the Line, thus, there will be no changes in existing transportation patterns or energy usage as a result of the proposed discontinuance and abandonment.

(iv) *Not applicable.* Abandonment of the Line will not cause the diversion of more than 1,000 rail carloads per year or an average of 50 rail carloads per mile per year to motor carriers.

5. Air

(i) *If the proposed action will result in either:*

- (A) *An increase in rail traffic of at least 100 percent (measured in gross ton miles annually) or an increase of at least eight trains a day on any segment of rail line affected by the proposal, or*

Response: (i) *Not applicable.*

(ii) *Not applicable.* Grafton County is not a class I or nonattainment area under the Clean Air Act. In any event, discontinuance and abandonment of the Line will not result in traffic increases which exceed the thresholds specified in 49 C.F.R. § 1105.7(e)(5)(ii)(A), (B) or (C).

(iii) *Not applicable.* No ozone depleting materials are transported over the Line, and no such shipments would be diverted as a result of this abandonment.

The State's representative has contacted and requested comments from the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services ("NHDES") and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"). The State's representative will contact all appropriate agencies as necessary and comply with all applicable regulations in its abandonment of the Line.

6. Noise

If any of the thresholds identified in item (5)(0) of this section are surpassed, state whether the proposed action will cause:

(i) *An incremental increase in noise levels of three decibels Ldn or more; or*

(ii) *An increase to a noise level of 65 decibels Ldn or greater.*

Response: *Not applicable.* None of the thresholds identified in 49 C.F.R. § 1105.7(c)(5)(i) will be exceeded as a result of the abandonment.

7. Safety

(ii) *If hazardous materials are expected to be transported, identify: the materials and quantity; the frequency of service; whether chemicals are being transported that, if mixed, could react to form more hazardous compounds; safety practices (including any speed restrictions); the applicant's safety record (to the extent available) on derailments, accidents and hazardous spills; the contingency plans to deal with accidental spills; and the likelihood of an accidental release of hazardous materials.*

Response: (i) The proposed action will have no adverse effect upon public health or safety.

All salvage activities will comply with all applicable rules and regulations.

(ii) *Not applicable.* No hazardous materials are transported on the Line, and in any event no such shipments would be diverted as a result of the discontinuance and abandonment.

(iii) There are no known hazardous waste sites or sites where there have been known hazardous material spills on the right-of-way of the Line.

8. Biological Resources

(i) Based on consultation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, state whether the proposed action is likely to adversely affect endangered or threatened species or areas designated as a critical habitat, and if so, describe the effects.

(ii) State whether wildlife sanctuaries or refuges, National or State parks or forests will be affected, and describe any effects.

Response: (i) The Line is located in a generally wooded area in Lebanon, NH. The Line runs near residential and commercial buildings as well as Interstate 89 and Route 4. The Line also runs along and across the Mascoma River in places. After discontinuance and abandonment, the rail, ties and other track material will be salvaged and the railbed will remain in place. There is a potential for the abandoned corridor to be used for trail purposes, thus, CCRC and the State do not believe that any critical habitat will be destroyed, altered or affected as a result of the proposed abandonment, or that any endangered or threatened species are present in the area or would be adversely affected. The State's and CCRC's representative has contacted the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service ("USFWS"). See correspondence and accompanying research attached herein. Their representative also has requested comments from the NHDES. As of the date of the filing, the NHDES has not responded.

(ii) The Line does not pass through and is not adjacent to any wildlife sanctuaries or refuges or any national or state parks or forests and, accordingly, none will be adversely affected. The State's representative has contacted and requested comments from the National Park Service ("NPS"). As of the date of the filing, the NPS has not responded.

9. Water

(i) Based on consultation with State water quality officials, state whether the proposed action is consistent with applicable Federal, State or local water quality standards. Describe any inconsistencies.

(ii) Based on consultation with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, state whether permits under section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 US. C. 1344) are required for the proposed action and whether any designated wetlands or 1 00-year flood plains will be affected. Describe the effects.

(iii) State whether permits under section 402 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S. C. 1342) are required for the proposed action. Describe any actions that are proposed to mitigate adverse environmental impacts, indicating why the proposed mitigation is appropriate.

Response: Any water quality effects of the proposed abandonment should be minimal. The Line crosses the Mascoma River in several places. The Line is not within a Coastal Zone. CCRC and the State do not anticipate discharge of any materials into navigable waters that would require permits under Sections 402 and 404 of the Clean Water Act. To CCRC's and the State's knowledge no 100-year flood plains would be affected by the discontinuance and abandonment.

There is a potential wetlands area located in the Line to be abandoned. The parties will take all steps necessary to reduce and minimize any potential effects. There may be fill placed in the wetlands to provide a suitable walking trail, or the trail may be moved to another location nearby so as to minimize wetlands impact. Those plans are still being worked out and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, New England District was contacted and is in the process of providing comments regarding the wetlands. Information on the proposed abandonment has also been provided to the U.S. EPA and USFWS. See correspondence attached herein.

HISTORIC REPORT - 49 C.F.R. § 1105.8(d)

1. Map

A map of the Line is attached hereto as Appendix A.

2. Description of Line

The State of New Hampshire (“the State”) proposes to abandon and the Claremont Concord Railroad Corporation (“CCRC”) proposes to discontinue service and operating rights under its lease with the State, between railroad milepost 140 at Station 3515+69 on map v32.1-68 to approximately railroad milepost B141 at Station 3568+49 on map v32.1-69 in Lebanon, Grafton County, New Hampshire, a distance of approximately 0.97 miles. The right-of-way width ranges from 41 feet to 82.5 feet. Pursuant to the Board’s policy, the railroad’s right-of-way will constitute the Area of Potential Effect (“APE”) for this undertaking.

Following abandonment and discontinuance of service and operating rights the Line segment will be salvaged. Salvage operations will consist of removing the track structure from the existing roadbed. The contours of the existing roadbed will remain as is and existing drainage systems will remain intact. When the track structure is removed, a contractor will smooth the roadbed to a level surface.

3. Photographs

There are two bridges located within the segment that is proposed to be abandoned. See attached photographs.

4. Information on Structures

There are no buildings on the Line which are fifty years old or older. One bridge was built in 1912 and the other bridge was built in 1914.

5. History of Operations

The Line is leased to CCRC by the State and was previously used for general freight traffic. CCRC and the State believe that there have been no rail shipments of any kind on the Line in well over two years and no reasonable possibility for the development of new rail traffic exists. The Line between milepost 80.68 at Boscawen and milepost 140 at Lebanon, in Merrimack and Grafton Counties, NH, consisting of a 59.32 mile segment was abandoned in December 1991, see Docket No. AB-32 (Sub-No. 45X).

6. Engineering Documents

CCRC and the State will provide copies of any documents in its possession upon request.

7. Historic Criteria

The State's representative has contacted and requested comments from the State Historic Preservation Office within the New Hampshire Division of Historical Resources ("NHDHR"). See correspondence attached herein. The NHDHR has indicated that no historic properties will be affected by the discontinuance and abandonment. The NHDHR has made a *Determination of Eligibility* for the Northern Railroad, incorporated in 1844, which has been listed because it is considered to be one of the oldest and longest in the State of New Hampshire. The file has been reviewed at the NHDHR and a Request for Project Relief has been filed with the Cultural

Resources Department at the NH Department of Transportation.

8. Ground Disturbances

CCRC and the State report that there are may be some archaeological resources in the area. The National Geodetic Survey has been contacted. While some potentially affected markers were flagged by the National Geodetic Survey, all of those markers are located at or near the Lebanon Airport and will not be affected by the discontinuance and abandonment. See correspondence attached herein. Access to the line is generally good.





11. Regional and/or local use plans; and
12. The need for permits under Sections 402 or 404 of the Clean Water Act.

Because of the nature of the proposed action, we foresee no adverse effects. Nevertheless, we would appreciate your review and any comments to the enclosed Report. The applicable statutes and regulations impose stringent deadlines for processing this action, therefore, your written comments to SEA (with a copy to Ashley Romeo-Boles) would be appreciated within 3 weeks. Your comments will be considered by the Board in evaluating the environmental and/or historic preservation impacts of the contemplated action. 

Notice of Petition for Exemption to Discontinue Service and Abandon

The State of New Hampshire (“the State”) and the Claremont Concord Railroad Corporation (“CCRC”) gives notice that on or about December 20, 2015, it intends to file with the Surface Transportation Board, Washington, DC 20423, a petition for Discontinuance of Service and exemption under 49 C.F.R. § 1152 for CCRC to discontinue its rail common carrier obligation over the line of railroad (“the Line”) and to allow the State to abandon the Line beginning at Railroad Milepost B140, Station 3515+69 on map v32.1-68 and ending at Railroad Milepost B141, Station 3568+49 on map v32.1-69 in Lebanon, Grafton County, New Hampshire, which traverses through United States Postal Service ZIP Code 03766, a distance of approximately 0.97 miles.

Based on available information, the Line does not contain federally granted rights-of-way. Any documentation in the State’s or CCRC’s possession will be made available promptly to those requesting it.

The interest of railroad employees will be protected by the conditions specified in

Oregon Short Line R. Co. -- Abandonment - Goshen. 360 I.C.C. 91 (1979).

Appropriate offers of financial assistance to continue rail service can be filed with the Board pursuant to 49 U.S.C. 10904 and will be due 120 days after the application is filed or 10 days after the application is granted by the Board, whichever occurs sooner.

All interested parties should be aware that following abandonment of rail service and salvage of the line, the Line may be suitable for other public uses, including interim trail use.

Any request for a public use condition and any request for trail use/rail banking under 49 U.S.C. 10905 also can be filed with the Board and will be due no later than 10 days after notice of the filing of the petition for exemption is published in the Federal Register.

An original and 10 copies of any pleading that raises matters other than environmental issues (such as trails use, public use, and offers of financial assistance) must be filed directly with the Board's Section of Administration, Office of Proceedings, 395 E. St., SW., Washington, DC 20423-0001 [See 49 C.F.R. 11 04.1(a) and 11 04.3(a)], and one copy must be served on applicants' representative [See 49 C.F.R. 1104.1 2(a)].

Written comments and protests, including all requests for public use and trail use conditions, must indicate the proceeding designation STB No. AB11 (Sub-No. 18X) and should be filed with the Chief, Section of Administration, Office of Proceedings, Surface Transportation Board, Washington, DC 20423-0001, no later than February 5, 2015. Interested persons may file a written comment or protest with the Board to become a party to this abandonment proceeding. A copy of each written comment or protest shall be served upon the representative of the applicant: Ashley J. Romeo-Boles, Esq., at Schuster, Buttrey & Wing, P.A., 79 Hanover St., PO Box 388, Lebanon, NH 03766, (603) 448-4782, ashleyrb@ivylegal.com. The original and 10 copies of all comments or protests shall be filed with the Board with a certificate of service.

Except as otherwise set forth in part 1152, every document filed with the Board must be served on all parties to the abandonment proceeding. 49 CFR 1104.12(a).

CCRC and the State have certified that: (1) no local traffic has moved over the Line for at least 2 years; (2) there is no overhead traffic on the subject line because the subject Line is not a "through line;" (3) no formal complaint filed by a user of rail service on the Line (or by a state or local government entity acting on behalf of such user) regarding cessation of service over the line either is pending with the Surface Transportation Board (Board) or with any U.S. District Court or has been decided in favor of complainant within the 2-year period; and (4) the requirements at 49 C.F.R. § 1105.7(c) (environmental report), 49 C.F.R. § 1105.11 (transmittal letter), 49 C.F.R. § 1105.12 (newspaper publication), and 49 C.F.R. § 1152.50(d)(I) (notice to governmental agencies) have been met.

The line sought to be abandoned will be available for subsidy or sale for continued rail use, if the Board decides to permit the abandonment in accordance with applicable laws and regulations (49 U.S.C. 10904 and 49 CFR 1152.27). No subsidy arrangement approved under 49 U.S.C. 10904 shall remain in effect for more than 1 year unless otherwise mutually agreed by the parties (49 U.S.C. 10904(f)(4)(B)). Applicant will promptly provide upon request to each interested party an estimate of the subsidy and minimum purchase price required to keep the line in operation. CCRC's and the State's representative to whom inquiries may be made concerning sale or subsidy terms is Ashley J. Romeo-Boles, Esq., at Schuster, Buttrey & Wing, P.A., 79 Hanover St., PO Box 388, Lebanon, NH 03766, (603) 448-4782, ashleyrb@ivylegal.com.

Persons seeking further information concerning abandonment procedures may contact the Surface Transportation Board or refer to the full abandonment or discontinuance regulations at 49 CFR part 1152. Questions may be directed to the Board's Office of Public Assistance,

Government Affairs and Compliance at (202) 245-0233. Questions concerning environmental issues may be directed to the Board's Office of Environmental Analysis.

The CCRC and the State have filed a combined environmental and historic report which addresses the effects, if any, of the abandonment on the environment and historic resources. The Board's Office of Environmental Analysis ("OEA") will generally prepare an environmental assessment ("EA") which will normally be available 30 days after the filing of the notice of exemption. Questions concerning environmental issues may be directed to the Board's OEA. Any EA (or environmental impact statement ("EIS"), if necessary) prepared by the OEA will be served upon all parties of record and upon any agencies or other persons who commented during its preparation. Interested persons may obtain a copy of the EA (or EIS) by writing to the OEA, Room 1100, Surface Transportation Board, Washington, DC 20423 or by calling OEA at (202) 245-0295. Comments on environmental and historic preservation matters must be filed no later than fifteen (15) days after the EA becomes available to the public and will be addressed in the Board's decision. The deadline for submission of comments on the EA will generally be within 30 days of its service.

Pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 1152.29(e)(2), CCRC shall file a notice of consummation with the Board to signify that it has exercised the authority granted and fully abandoned the line. If consummation has not been effected by CCRC's filing of a notice of consummation by December 2015, and there are no legal or regulatory barriers to consummation, the authority to abandon will automatically expire. Board decisions and notices are available on our Web site at www.stb.dot.gov.
