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
RE: Proposed Abandonment of the Royal Industrial Lead from Milepost 475.15 to Milepost 477.10 near Laurens, a total distance of 1.95 miles, in Pocahontas County, Iowa (the "Line"); STB Docket No. AB-33 (Sub-No. 304X)

Dear Ms. Brown:

Union Pacific Railroad Company ("Union Pacific") has received a request from the Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation on behalf of the Pocahontas County Conservation Board and the City of Laurens (collectively, "INHF Trail Group") dated April 9, 2013 seeking a 180 day extension of the negotiation period to October 6, 2013 for interim trail use and rail banking under the provisions of 16 U.S.C. § 1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. § 1152.29 regarding that portion of the Union Pacific's right-of-way known as the Royal Industrial Lead, as defined above, a distance of 1.95 miles in Pocahontas County, Iowa. Based on the original decision in this matter with a Service Date of September 21, 2012, the original 180 day negotiation period ended on March 20, 2013. Even though the April 9, 2013 letter appears to be late, Union Pacific is still willing to extend the negotiation period for 180 days beyond March 20, 2013, the last day of the original negotiation period, to September 17, 2013.

The Union Pacific is willing to continue to negotiate with INHF Trail Group concerning the acquisition of the subject property for trail use and supports the INHF Trail Group's request for a 180-day extension of the negotiation period with regard to the Line from Milepost 475.15 to Milepost 477.10 for a total distance of 1.95 miles to September 17, 2013. A copy of INHF Trail Group's request to extend the negotiation period is attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and is hereby made a part hereof.

Motion to Extend the Time Period for Negotiation of an
Interim Trail Use/Railbanking Agreement

In partnership and on behalf of the Pocahontas County Conservation Board, the City of Laurens (public agencies) and the Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation (non-profit corporation) hereby moves the Surface Transportation Board (STB or Board) to extend the time period for negotiation of a mutually acceptable interim trail use/railbanking agreement in this proceeding up and including **October 6, 2013**.

The Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation (INHF) and the public agencies have been negotiating with the Union Pacific Railroad Company (UPRR), but the parties need additional time to complete the negotiations.

To successfully preserve this corridor for interim trail use and railbanking under section 8(d) of the National Trails System Act, 16 U.S.C. 1247 (d), it is necessary for the negotiation period under the NITU to be extended up to and including **October 6, 2013**. See Policy Statement on Rails to Trails

EXHIBIT "A"



Conversions, Ex Parte No. 274 (Sub. No. 13b) (ICC served Feb. 5, 1990) (extensions of time promote the establishment of trails and railbanking consistent with the National Trails System Act):

Since the issuance of the NITU, UPRR at all points has maintained intent to transfer the line intact for interim trail use. The railroad has not sold, or offered for sale, any parcels of land that would interfere with interim trail use and railbanking of the portion of the corridor that is covered by the NITU (Milepost 475.15 and Milepost 477.10). The line remains intact and throughout the period, the railroad has been negotiating with INHF for the transfer or sale of the corridor intact. Accordingly, the Board retains jurisdiction to extend the NITU to continue bona fide and active negotiations for interim trail use of the line.

In similar instances, this Board has reopened proceedings to permit the issuance of orders implementing section 8(d) for rail lines. The STB's authority to extend a NITU was upheld in Birt v. STB, 90 F.3d 580 (D.C. Cir. 1996). Here the parties merely seek an extension in the period for negotiation provided in a previously issued NITU. Such an extension will promote and further the purposes of the Trails Act.

For the reasons stated, INHF on behalf of the Pocahontas County Conservation Board, the City of Laurens requests that an extension of the NITU negotiation period be granted through **October 6, 2013**.
