

**THE CITY OF FORT ATKINSON REQUEST FOR AN EXTENSION
OF NOTICE OF INTERIM TRAIL USE**

BACKGROUND

On September 18, 1998, the Union Pacific Railroad Company (UP) filed with the Surface Transportation Board (Board) a petition under 49 C.F.R. § 1152, Subpart F -- Exempt Abandonments and Discontinuance of Service and Trackage Rights, for an exempt abandonment and discontinuance of operations over a line of railroad known as the Clyman Branch, extending from the end of the line at railroad milepost 110.0 to railroad milepost 112.0 near Fort Atkinson, a distance of 2.0 miles in Jefferson County, WI. The line traverses through U.S. Postal Service ZIP code 53538.

On July 28, 1998, the City of Fort Atkinson (City) signed a Statement of Willingness to Accept Financial Responsibility pursuant to 49 C.F.R. § 1152.29. This statement is for the segment of UP railroad line at railroad milepost 110.0 to railroad milepost 112.0 near Fort Atkinson, a distance of 2.0 miles in Jefferson County, WI.

On October 13, 1998, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) on behalf of the City filed a request for a notice of interim trail use/rail banking (NITU) under 16 U.S.C. 1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. 1152.29. UP indicated its willingness to negotiate with the

City for interim trail use. The Board issued a NITU under 49 C.F.R. 1152.29, which was served on November 5, 1998, allowing the City until May 7, 1999 to negotiate a rail banking agreement with UP.

On April 7, 1999, the WisDOT on behalf of the City filed a request for a NITU under 16 U.S.C. 1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. 1152.29. UP was agreeable to the NITU extension. The Board issued a NITU under 49 C.F.R. 1152.29, which was served on April 30, 1999, allowing the City until November 3, 1999 to negotiate a rail banking agreement with UP.

On October 7, 1999, the WisDOT on behalf of the City filed a request for a NITU under 16 U.S.C. 1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. 1152.29. UP was agreeable to the NITU extension. The Board issued a NITU under 49 C.F.R. 1152.29, which was served on October 21, 1999, allowing the City until May 1, 2000 to negotiate a rail banking agreement with UP.

On June 29, 2000, the WisDOT on behalf of the City filed a request for a NITU under 16 U.S.C. 1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. 1152.29. UP was agreeable to the NITU extension. The Board issued a NITU under 49 C.F.R. 1152.29, which was served on July 3, 2000, allowing the City until October 28, 2000 to negotiate a rail banking agreement with UP.

On October 10, 2000, the WisDOT on behalf of the City filed a request for a NITU under 16 U.S.C. 1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. 1152.29. UP was agreeable to the NITU extension. The Board issued a NITU under 49 C.F.R. 1152.29, which was served on October 12, 2000, allowing the City until April 26, 2000 to negotiate a rail banking agreement with UP.

On April 11, 2001, the WisDOT on behalf of the City filed a request for a NITU under 16 U.S.C. 1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. 1152.29. UP was agreeable to the NITU extension. The Board issued a NITU under 49 C.F.R. 1152.29, which was served on April 24, 2001, allowing the City until October 23, 2001 to negotiate a rail banking agreement with UP.

On October 22, 2001, the WisDOT on behalf of the City filed a request for a NITU under 16 U.S.C. 1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. 1152.29. UP was agreeable to the NITU extension.

The Board issued a NITU under 49 C.F.R. 1152.29, which was served on October 30, 2001, allowing the City until April 21, 2001 to negotiate a rail banking agreement with UP.

On April 19, 2002, the WisDOT on behalf of the City filed a request for a NITU under 16 U.S.C. 1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. 1152.29. UP was agreeable to the NITU extension. The Board issued a NITU under 49 C.F.R. 1152.29, which was served on April 26, 2002, allowing the City until October 18, 2002 to negotiate a rail banking agreement with UP.

The City and UP have a tentative agreement but more time is needed to reach a final agreement.

MOTION

Therefore, WisDOT respectfully requests that the Board extend the period prescribed to negotiate an interim trail use/rail banking agreement for an additional 180 days for the land corridor and related real property, including bridge structures, on a line of railroad known as the Clyman Branch, extending from the end of the line at railroad milepost 110.0 to railroad milepost 112.0 near Fort Atkinson, a distance of 2.0 miles in Jefferson County, WI, for interim trail use and rail banking, pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 1247(d) and 49 C.F.R. § 1152.29 to the City of Fort Atkinson.
