VERIFIED NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

COMES NOW Norfolk Southern Railway Company ("NSR") and Yadkin Railroad Company ("Yadkin") (collectively "Railroads") and file this notice of exemption from regulation under 49 U.S.C. §§ 10903, pursuant to the provisions of 49 U.S.C. § 10502 and 49 CFR § 1152.50, for discontinuance of service and operating rights under a lease over, and abandonment of the line of railroad lying between mileposts N 27.50 in North Albemarle and N 31.64 in Albemarle, Stanly County, North Carolina.

Pursuant to the Board's regulations codified at 49 CFR § 1152.50, the Railroads state as follows:

Traffic Certification - §§ 1152.50(b) and (d)(2)

As the attached certificate of General Manager B. A. Burgess confirms, no traffic has originated, terminated or moved overhead on this line segment for at least two years (or any overhead traffic on the line can be rerouted over other lines), and no complaint is pending with the Board or a U. S. District Court or has been decided in favor of a complainant concerning cessation of service over this line within the two-year period.

Consummation Date - § 1152.50(d)(2)

The effective date of the discontinuance of service and abandonment between mileposts N 27.50 in North Albemarle and N 31.64 in Albemarle, Stanly County, North Carolina, will be December 14, 2006.

General Corporate Information - § 1152.22(a)(1-2) and (7)

The parties filing this notice are Norfolk Southern Railway Company, a common carrier by railroad, and Yadkin Railroad Company, a wholly owned subsidiary of Norfolk Southern Railway Company, subject to STB jurisdiction under the Interstate Commerce Commission Termination Act (Interstate Transportation Act) (49 U.S.C. Description of the Line and the Relief Sought - § 1152.22(a)(3-4 and 7)

The relief sought is an exemption from the prior approval requirements of 49 U.S.C. §10903 in order for NSR to discontinue service and operating rights under a lease over and for Yadkin to abandon the subject line. The line that will be subject to discontinuance and abandonment under the exemption consists of 4.14 miles of track between mileposts N 27.50 in North Albemarle and N 31.64 in Albemarle, Stanly County, North Carolina. A map showing the line to be abandoned, other rail lines in the area, highways, and population centers is attached as Exhibit 1 to this notice. The line traverses United States Postal Service ZIP Code 28001 in Stanly County, North Carolina. The line includes the former stations of North Albemarle and Albemarle.

Suitability of the Line for Other Public Purposes - § 1152.22(e)(4)

The railroads have received no inquiries about public use of the right-of-way comprising the Line and are unaware of any potential public purposes to which the right-of-way may be suited.

The portion of the subject line from milepost N 27.50, just south of Bethany Road, up to the US-52 crossing at milepost N 29.60 will be reclassified as an industrial lead track and left in place for future industrial opportunities. Rail and track materials will be salvaged on the remaining segment of the line, approximately two miles in length, between milepost N 29.60 and the end of the line at milepost N 31.64.

Labor Protection - § 1152.50(d)(2)

Since the line has been out of service for over two years, the Railroads believe no employees will be adversely affected by exercise of discontinuance and abandonment authority for this line. However, as a condition to exercise of the authority permitted in this matter, the Railroads will accept the imposition of standard labor protective conditions as set forth in Oregon Short Line R. Co. - Abandonment - Goshen, 360 I.C.C. 91 (1979).

Environmental and Historic Reports; Certifications - § 1105.7 and § 1105.8

Attached are environmental and historical reports prepared and served in accordance with the Surface Transportation Board's regulations. The Railroads certify that the notice and transmittal requirements of § 1105.7, § 1105.8 and § 1105.11 have been met.


The Railroads have consulted with the North Carolina State Historic Preservation Officer, and the North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources, Division of Archives and History has responded that the undertaking will have no effect upon historic structures as proposed. A copy of the NCDRCR response is attached to the Historic Report.

Service and Newspaper Notice Requirements Certification - § 1152.50(d)(1-2)

As the attached certification indicates, the Railroads certify that they have complied with the service and notice requirements of § 1152.50(d)(1)(certain government agencies) and § 1105.12 (newspaper notice).

For the foregoing reasons, NSR and Yadkin believe the proposed rail line discontinuance and abandonment is exempt from the prior approval requirements of 49 U.S.C. §§ 10903 pursuant to 49 C.F.R. § 1152.50 and request that the Board serve the appropriate notice of exemption.

PROPOSED RAIL LINE ABANDONMENT AND DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE**

49 CFR 1105.7(e)(1) Proposed Action and Alternatives.

Describe the proposed action, including commodities transported, the planned disposition (if any) of any rail line and other structures that may be involved, and any possible changes in current operations or maintenance practices. Also describe any reasonable alternatives to the proposed action. Include a readable, detailed map and drawings clearly delineating the project.

RESPONSE: Norfolk Southern Railway Company (NSR) proposes to discontinue service and operating rights under a lease over, and Yadkin Railroad Company (Yadkin), a wholly-owned subsidiary of NSR, (collectively "railroads"), proposes to abandon, 4.14 miles of rail line between railroad milepost N 27.50 at North Albemarle and railroad milepost N 31.64 at Albemarle in Stanly County, North Carolina. The line proposed for abandonment has been dormant for many years. Over the years of dormancy, rail and track materials have been removed at several locations along the line, and several grade crossings on the line have been removed, including the signals and crossing materials at US-52 at milepost N 29.60 and Salisbury Avenue at milepost N 30.00.

The portion of the subject line from milepost N 27.50, just south of Bethany Road, up to the US-52 crossing at milepost N 29.60 will be reclassified as an industrial lead track and left in place for future industrial development opportunities. Rail and track materials will be salvaged on the remaining segment of the line, approximately two miles in length, between milepost N 29.60 and the end of the line at milepost N 31.64.

The only alternatives would be not to abandon the line or to discontinue service on the line and retain the track in place. These alternatives are not satisfactory. Service over the line is not required to serve any shippers. The railroads would incur opportunity and holding costs that would be absorbed by other customers were the line to be retained without being used for active rail freight service.

A map delineating the line proposed for abandonment is attached as **Appendix A**. The railroads' letter to federal, state and local government agencies is attached as **Appendix B**. Responses to the letter or other comments received as a result of consultations can be found in **Appendix C**.

49 CFR 1105.7(e)(2) Transportation system.

Describe the effects of the proposed action on regional or local transportation systems and patterns. Estimate the amount of traffic (passenger or freight) that will be diverted to other transportation systems or modes as a result of the proposed action.

RESPONSE: Effects of the proposed action on regional or local transportation systems and patterns are expected to be negligible. There is no rail freight or passenger traffic on the line segment proposed for abandonment. Consequently, no rail traffic will be diverted to highway or other modes as a result of the abandonment.

49 CFR 1105.7(e)(3) Land use.

(i) Based on consultation with local and/or regional planning agencies and/or a review of the official planning documents prepared by such agencies, state whether the proposed action is consistent with existing land use plans. Describe any inconsistencies.

RESPONSE: An outline of future land use plans was requested from the Manager of Stanly County and from Stanly County's Planning, Community Development and Zoning department and from the City Manager of Albemarle. These agencies were also asked to comment on the consistency of the proposed abandonment with existing

land use plans. The Stanly County Planning and Zoning Director advised that as the line segment is entirely within the City of Albemarle, he would allow the City to determine consistency with land use plans. The City of Albemarle Director of Planning and Community Development advised that the proposed abandonment is consistent with existing land use plans as the city would like to transform this corridor into a greenway. The Stanly County Economic Development Commission advised that they are supportive of the project. This correspondence is attached in **Appendix C**.

Subsequent to the distribution of this report, the North Carolina State Clearinghouse received correspondence from Raymond L. Allen, City Manager of the City of Albemarle, in which he states that the City Council has voted unanimously to support the proposal. A copy of this correspondence, as well as a copy of all information received from the North Carolina State Clearinghouse, is attached in **Appendix C**.

(ii) Based on consultation with the U.S. Soil Conservation Service, state the effect of the proposed action on any prime agricultural land.

RESPONSE: The United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service (USDA-NRCS) determined that there is land classified as prime agricultural land lying under and adjacent to the rail line, but that the proposed action of abandonment would have no negative effect on the use of this prime agricultural land unless the adjacent land were rendered inaccessible. A copy of the response received from the USDA-NRCS is included in **Appendix C**.

(iii) If the action affects land or water uses within a designated coastal zone, include the coastal zone information required by Sec. 1105.9.

RESPONSE: Not Applicable, as the property is not located in a coastal zone.

(iv) If the proposed action is an abandonment, state whether or not the right-of-way is suitable for alternative public use under 49 U.S.C. 10906 and explain why.

RESPONSE: The portion of the right-of-way between mileposts N 27.50 and N 29.60 will be retained as an industrial lead track and thus continue to be used for railroad purposes so it will not be available for alternative public use. The remainder of the right-of-way should be suitable for alternative use.

49 CFR 1105.7(e)(4) Energy.

(i) Describe the effect of the proposed action on transportation of energy resources.

RESPONSE: Development and transportation of energy resources will not be affected by the abandonment as no freight or passenger traffic has moved over the line for many years.

(ii) Describe the effect of the proposed action on recyclable commodities.

RESPONSE: Movement or recovery of recyclable commodities will not be affected by the abandonment as no freight or passenger traffic has moved over the line for many years.

(iii) State whether the proposed action will result in an increase or decrease in overall energy efficiency and explain why.

RESPONSE: The proposed action will not result in an increase or decrease in overall energy efficiency.

*(iv) If the proposed action will cause diversions from rail to motor carriage of more than:
(A) 1,000 rail carloads a year; or
(B) An average of 50 rail carloads per mile per year for any part of the affected line, quantify the resulting net change in energy consumption and show the data and methodology used to arrive at the figure given.*

RESPONSE: No traffic will be diverted from rail to motor carriage as a result of the proposed action.

49 CFR 1105.7(e)(5) Air.

(i) If the proposed action will result in either:

(A) An increase in rail traffic of at least 100 percent (measured in gross ton miles annually) or an increase of at least eight trains a day on any segment of rail line affected by the proposal, or

(B) An increase in rail yard activity of at least 100 percent (measured by carload activity), or

(C) An average increase in truck traffic of more than 10 percent of the average daily traffic or 50 vehicles a day on any affected road segment, quantify the anticipated effect on air emissions.

RESPONSE: The above thresholds will not be exceeded.

(ii) If the proposed action affects a class I or nonattainment area under the Clean Air Act, and will result in either:

(A) An increase in rail traffic of at least 50 percent (measured in gross ton miles annually) or an increase of at least three trains a day on any segment of rail line,

(B) An increase in rail yard activity of at least 20 percent (measured by carload activity), or

(C) An average increase in truck traffic of more than 10 percent of the average daily traffic or 50 vehicles a day on a given road segment, then state whether any expected increased emissions are within the parameters established by the State Implementation Plan.

RESPONSE: The above thresholds will not be exceeded. Stanly County, North Carolina is in attainment for all National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) pollutants according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

(iii) If transportation of ozone depleting materials (such as nitrogen oxide and Freon®) is contemplated, identify: the materials and quantity; the frequency of service; safety practices (including any speed restrictions); the applicant's safety record (to the extent available) on derailments, accidents and spills; contingency plans to deal with accidental spills; and the likelihood of an accidental release of ozone depleting materials in the event of a collision or derailment.

RESPONSE: Not applicable.

49 CFR 1105.7(e)(6) Noise.

If any of the thresholds identified in item (5)(i) of this section are surpassed, state whether the proposed action will cause:

(i) An incremental increase in noise levels of three decibels Ldn or more; or

(ii) An increase to a noise level of 65 decibels Ldn or greater.

RESPONSE: The above thresholds will not be exceeded.

49 CFR 1105.7(e)(7) Safety.

(i) Describe any effects of the proposed action on public health and safety (including vehicle delay time at railroad grade crossings).

RESPONSE: Abandonment of the captioned rail line will have no significant effect upon public health or safety. Moreover, the closing of the remaining at-grade crossings on the segment to be abandoned and salvaged enhances public safety by eliminating distractions to vehicular traffic crossing the line. A list of the crossings on the line segment and their current status is provided in **Appendix D**.

(ii) If hazardous materials are expected to be transported, identify: the materials and quantity; the frequency of service; whether chemicals are being transported that, if mixed, could react to form more hazardous compounds; safety practices (including any speed restrictions); the applicant's safety record (to the extent available) on derailments, accidents and hazardous spills; the contingency plans to deal with accidental spills; and the likelihood of an accidental release of hazardous materials.

RESPONSE: Not applicable.

(iii) If there are any known hazardous waste sites or sites where there have been known hazardous materials spills on the right-of-way, identify the location of those sites and the types of hazardous materials involved.

RESPONSE: The railroads have no knowledge of hazardous waste sites or sites where there have been known hazardous material spills on the right of way or in adjacent areas.

49 CFR 1105.7(e)(8) Biological Resources.

(i) Based on consultation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, state whether the proposed action is likely to adversely affect endangered or threatened species or areas designated as a critical habitat, and if so, describe the effects.

RESPONSE: A search of public records has indicated eight endangered and/or threatened species which may occur in Stanly County as summarized below:

A consultation was requested from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) to ascertain any impacts to surrounding habitats and species. The response of USFWS, attached in **Appendix C**, states that the abandonment is not likely to adversely affect any federally listed endangered or threatened species and that the requirements under Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act are fulfilled.

(ii) State whether wildlife sanctuaries or refuges, National or State parks or forests will be affected, and describe any effects.

RESPONSE: Based on the site investigation, the line segment proposed for abandonment does not pass through state parks or forests, national parks or forests, or wildlife sanctuaries. No adverse effects on wildlife sanctuaries, National Parks or Forests, or State Parks or Forests are anticipated.

49 CFR 1105.7(e)(9) Water.

(i) Based on consultation with State water quality officials, state whether the proposed action is consistent with applicable Federal, State or local water quality standards. Describe any inconsistencies.

RESPONSE: As described above, the portion of the subject line from milepost N 27.50, just south of Bethany Road, and milepost N 29.60 up to the US-52 crossing will be reclassified as an industrial lead track and left in place for future industrial development opportunities. Rail and track materials will be salvaged on the remaining segment of the line.

There are no plans to remove or alter the contour of the roadbed underlying any part of the rail line to be abandoned. Since there are no plans to undertake in-stream work, or dredge and/or fill any materials in connection with the proposed abandonment, water quality impacts are not expected in connection with the proposed action. Consultation

has been requested from the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources and from the United States Environmental Protection Agency. The response of USEPA, attached in **Appendix C**, states that based on the information provided, it appears that this activity is not subject to NPDES permitting requirements.

Subsequent to the distribution of this report, a response was received from the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources, which states that the Department supports the City of Albemarle's interest in converting the abandoned right-of-way to public trail use. A copy of this response is attached in **Appendix C**.

(ii) Based on consultation with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, state whether permits under section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1344) are required for the proposed action and whether any designated wetlands or 100-year flood plains will be affected. Describe the effects.

RESPONSE: The rail line proposed for abandonment crosses three small waterways at mileposts N 29.50, N 29.90, and N 31.50. The track at milepost N 29.50 will be retained as an industrial lead. The bridge at milepost N 31.50 is covered with dense vegetation and the rail leading up to it is missing. Thus no removal of rail or crossties or any other salvage activity will occur in the vicinity of those two bridges.

Salvage activity will occur at milepost N 29.90, but the geometry of the roadbed will not be altered and no in-stream work is contemplated. No discernible effects on either 100-year flood plains or adjacent wetlands are expected in connection with the proposed abandonment. Consequently, the railroads do not believe a Section 404 permit will be required in connection with the proposed abandonment. A consultation was requested from the US Army Corps of Engineers. The response of USACE, attached in **Appendix C**, states that the proposed project does not impact jurisdictional waters or wetlands and no Department of the Army Authorization is Required.

(iii) State whether permits under section 402 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1342)

are required for the proposed action.

RESPONSE: There are no intentions to remove or alter the roadbed underlying the line to be abandoned, to undertake in-stream work or to dredge or to use any fill materials. There should be no significant effects to water quality. Thus, the railroads do not believe that a permit under Section 402 of the Clean Water Act will be required.

The US Environmental Protection Agency advises that it appears that this activity is not subject to National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permitting requirements, but that the response received from the State of North Carolina department of Environment and Natural Resources (NC DENR) should be relied upon for a final determination in this matter.

The NC DENR, Division of Water Quality, advises that land disturbance associated with the abandonment appears to be minimal, but recommends contact with the North Carolina Division of Land Resources (NCDLR) to assure compliance with state erosion and sedimentation and control requirements. A copy of this report is being served on NCDLR. Copies of this correspondence are attached in **Appendix C**.

49 CFR 1105.7(e)(10) Proposed Mitigation.

Describe any actions that are proposed to mitigate adverse environmental impacts, indicating why the proposed mitigation is appropriate.


RESPONSE: Abandonment of the involved rail line is not expected to produce adverse environmental impacts. Only minimal physical activity may occur, such as removal of rail, ties, and other railroad appurtenances, and only on a short segment of the subject line. The railroads will undertake all reasonable mitigation associated with these activities to assure the abandonment does not produce adverse environmental impacts.

Additional Information - National Geodetic Survey Marker

Attached in **Appendix C** is a response from the National Geodetic Survey stating there are approximately 15 National Geodetic Survey markers on or near the Line. NGS requests a 90-day advance notice to attempt formal relocation if the markers will be disturbed by the abandonment.



On behalf of Stanly County, please accept the following as our response to the proposed abandonment of the 4.14 miles of rail line as indicated in the March 2, 2006 letter sent by Marcellus C. Kirchner and subsequently addressed in correspondence with Sarah Corey on June 26, 2006.

While this section of track is currently not utilized for industrial customers, recent local events have made the continued viability of at least a portion of the line a top priority for our Economic Development Commissioner and Board of County Commissioners. Currently the former E J Snyder Mills, which closed earlier this year, sits vacant along this section of rail. We have received significant interest in the property, but said interest absolutely requires that rail service be available. Additionally, Collins & Aikman, a major automotive supplier who is currently undergoing reorganization, also sits along this corridor. With the continued rise in fuel prices, it stands to reason that they, like so many others, may reconsider their shipping options in the near future, reopening the possibility of rail assisted operations.

The opportunity to reinvigorate the E J Snyder Mills was the major driver behind our efforts to contact Ms. Sarah Corey. As a result of those discussions, and as stated in her letter dated June 26, 2006, it is our understanding that the portion of track from mile post N. 27.5 to the US 52 crossing will be left and an "Industrial Lead Track".

We are very supportive of this, as opposed to abandonment, and hope that in the near future we can work with Norfolk Southern to once again implement rail service along this line.

With regards to the removal and salvage of the rail lines south of the US 52 crossing, we have no objections.





As requested in our recent phone conversation, this letter outlines Norfolk Southern Railway's (NS) plans for the rail right-of-way in Albemarle, NC. I have attached a map as well for a visual depiction.

- In the third quarter of 2006 NS expects to file at the Surface Transportation Board (STB) for authority to abandon the railroad right-of-way from milepost N-27.5 (just south of Bethany Road) in North Albemarle to milepost N-31.64 in Albemarle, approximately 4.14 miles.
- Please note the signals and crossing were removed from the US 52 location a couple of years ago. Likewise, the crossing was removed at the same time at Salisbury Avenue (MP N-29.7).
- Following receipt of abandonment authority from the STB, we plan to remove and salvage the rail and material from the US 52 crossing south to the end of the track at N-31.64.
- Per our discussions we plan to reclassify as industrial lead track part of the right-of-way and track to be abandoned as a line of railroad and to leave the rail and material in the ground over this segment from milepost N-27.5 to the US 52 crossing for industrial development opportunities. This action will enable NSR to retain this segment of track for railroad purposes but will enable NSR to operate over or to abandon the track in the future without further STB approval. If a new customer locates on this section of the right-of-way, the track may be reactivated as an industrial lead to serve the customer. However, any future customer will have to bear the cost of rehabilitating the track and right-of-way to ensure safe operations. This will require coordination with NC DOT to leave the Snugg Street crossing in place at approximately milepost N-29.1.





Norfolk Southern Railway Company recently requested information from our office concerning potential abandonment of rail line in Stanly County near Albemarle, N.C. You requested information on consistency of the project with state water quality requirements and specifically with regard to NPDES permitting (Section 402 of the Clean Water Act).

Based on the information in your letter it appears that land disturbance associated with the project will be minimal. However, you should be aware that state erosion and sedimentation control requirements might apply to you. You should contact the NC Division of Land Resources (DLR) to assure that you are meeting any applicable requirements of this program. If an erosion and sediment control plan approval is required for land disturbance of one acre or more, you must also meet the requirements of our Division's Construction NPDES Stormwater Discharge permit.

Your letter also noted removal of two bridges over small streams. Impacts to surface waters or wetland areas may trigger water quality requirements through federal or state programs (Sections 404 and 401 of the Clean Water Act). You should talk with staff in our Mooresville Regional Office to assure that there are no issues of this type with your proposed project. We would also encourage you to contact the local governments with jurisdiction in the project area to assure that any local requirements are met.

The NC Department of Environment and Natural Resources has reviewed the August 9, 2006 Environmental Report for Norfolk Southern Railway Company's and Yadkin Railroad Company's requests for Discontinuance of Service and Abandonment, respectively, in Stanly County, NC. Generally speaking it appears to reflect the current status of this proposal.

This Department supports the City of Albemarle's interest in converting the abandoned right-of-way to public trail use. Retaining part of the right-of-way as an industrial lead track diminishes the potential benefits of this infrastructure. It is hoped that NSR will be flexible if asked to consider rail with trail opportunities along this low volume section of right-of-way in the future.

A FERC Relicensing Agreement has been negotiated with Alcoa that is worth noting. Therein, the licensee offers a right of first refusal to the State on its rail corridor between Badin and Halls Ferry Junction. Should it be abandoned during the duration of the license, there is a reasonable possibility for a rail to trail conversion to be completed. This would create an eleven mile public use facility connecting Morrow Mountain State Park to a point less than three miles north of this proposed action before the Surface Transportation Board in Albemarle. At that point, connecting the two public trail systems will become a key tourist economy priority, with corresponding benefits for non-motorized transportation, public health, and environmental protection/education.

The NC Conservation Tax Credit is also pertinent in this context. It is available when interests in real property are donated to a qualified recipient for specified

conservation purposes. Thus, a fee simple donation of right-of-way would qualify where there is no intent to re-establish rail service. Also, a fee simple donation of right-of-way, with a rail with trail condition, would qualify where there is a potential for rail service to be re-established. More information on this conservation incentive program can be found at <http://ncctc.enr.state.nc.us>, and the opportunity is commended for review by NSR in the proposed action.

HISTORIC REPORT

PROPOSED RAIL LINE DISCONTINUANCE AND ABANDONMENT

PROPOSED ACTION AND ALTERNATIVES

Norfolk Southern Railway Company (NSR) proposes to discontinue service and operating rights under a lease over, and Yadkin Railroad Company (YRR), a wholly-owned subsidiary of NSR, (collectively "railroads"), proposes to abandon, 4.14 miles of rail line between railroad milepost N 27.50 at North Albemarle and railroad milepost N 31.64 at Albemarle in Stanly County, North Carolina. The abandonment and discontinuance will end the railroads' common carrier obligations to provide service over this line of railroad.

The line proposed for abandonment has been dormant for many years. Over the years of dormancy, rail and track materials have been removed at several locations along the line, and several grade crossings on the line have been removed, including the signals and crossing materials at US-52 at milepost N 29.60 and Salisbury Avenue at milepost N 30.00.

The portion of the subject line from milepost N 27.50, just south of Bethany Road, up to the US-52 crossing at milepost N 29.60 will be reclassified as an industrial lead track and left in place for future industrial development opportunities. Rail and track materials will be salvaged on the remaining segment of the line, approximately two miles in length, between milepost N 29.60 and the end of the line at milepost N 31.64.

The only alternatives would be not to abandon the line or to discontinue service on the line and retain the track in place. These alternatives are not satisfactory. Service over the line is not required to serve any shippers. The railroads would incur opportunity and holding costs that would be absorbed by other customers were the line to be retained without being used for active rail freight service.

A map delineating the line proposed for abandonment/discontinuance is attached.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

(1) **U.S.G.S. Topographic Map** -- Maps were furnished to the Division of Archives and History of the North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources.

(2) **Written Description of Right of Way** -- The right of way width is 50 feet on each side of the main track centerline. The line passes through commercial, residential and agricultural areas.

(3) **Photographs** – **Photographs of the bridges** were furnished to the Division of Archives and History of the North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources.

(4) **Date of Construction of Structures** – Construction dates are shown on the Bridges and Structures List attached to this report.

(5) **History of Operations and Changes Contemplated** - Yadkin Railroad Company was incorporated in North Carolina, April 5, 1871 in order to insure that Salisbury, NC was connected by railroad to the line of the Cheraw and Salisbury Railroad Company at Wadesboro, NC. The Cheraw and Salisbury Railroad was being graded between Cheraw and Wadesboro at the time the Yadkin was incorporated. Nothing was done pursuant to the Yadkin charter until the Richmond and Danville Railroad Company constructed the line between Salisbury, NC and Norwood, NC in 1890-1891 and opened it on May 29, 1891. The Richmond and Danville Railroad Company acquired the mortgage, the bonds and most of the capital stock of the Yadkin Railroad Company at that time. The Richmond and Danville Railroad Company, and, after it was placed in receivership on June 15, 1892, its receivers, operated the line until July 1, 1894.

The Yadkin Railroad Company stock held by the Richmond and Danville Railroad Company receivers was sold on December 14, 1894 to the Richmond Terminal Reorganization Committee, which transferred the stock to Southern Railway Company. Southern Railway Company had also acquired through foreclosure sale, all of the outstanding bonds of the Yadkin Railroad Company. Southern Railway assumed operation of the property on July 1, 1894.

Effective July 1, 1916, the Yadkin Railroad Company commenced separate operations in its own name. These separate operations continued until the Yadkin Railroad's property was leased to the Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Southern Railway Company, on July 1, 1951. A predecessor of the Aluminum Company of America (Alcoa), Tallassee Power Company, built the railroad lines in Stanly County between Halls Ferry Jct., NC and Whitney, NC and between Whitney, NC and Badin, NC. Tallassee, and later Alcoa, leased the line segment between Halls Ferry Jct., NC and Whitney, NC to Yadkin Railroad Company on March 28, 1916. This agreement also provided for the joint lease by Yadkin Railroad Company and Winston-Salem Southbound Railway Company (WSSB) of the line segment between Whitney, NC and Badin, NC. WSSB, which was incorporated under a special act of the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina on January 31, 1905, is owned jointly by NSR and CSX Transportation, Inc., but independently operated. WSSB owns approximately 87.7 miles of main track between Winston-Salem, NC and Wadesboro, NC;

Yadkin Railroad Company abandoned 9.53 miles of line between Albemarle, NC and Norwood, NC pursuant to the Interstate Commerce Commission's decision in ICC

Finance Docket No. 11987, *Yadkin Railroad Company Abandonment*, 228 I.C.C. 735 (1938).

An Act of North Carolina entitled An Act to incorporate the Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company, ratified March 11, 1895 (Private Laws of North Carolina, 1895, ch.190, p. 306), provided for a new corporation which might purchase the property of the Chester and Lenoir Narrow Gauge Railroad Company and extend its line through the counties of Caldwell and Watauga to a point on the State line of Tennessee in the latter county. At that point, it might connect with the line of the East Tennessee and Western North Carolina Railroad Company. Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company took title to the Chester and Lenoir Narrow Gauge Railroad Company on February 8, 1897, from purchasers of the latter company in foreclosure of the second mortgage dated July 1, 1880. Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company was also chartered in South Carolina under an Act ratified February 17, 1900.

As a prerequisite to leasing the property of the Danville and Western Railway Company, a Virginia corporation, Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company had to qualify to operate in Virginia. This was done through the mechanism of organizing the *Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company of Virginia*, chartered February 5, 1951 under the general corporation laws of Virginia, with the power of owning, leasing, and operating railroads etc. in the State of Virginia. A Joint Agreement of Merger, dated March 20, 1951, between the new Virginia Corporation and its North and South Carolina parent company was then entered into and filed with the State Corporation Commission of Virginia. This effected the incorporation of the Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company, under its original North Carolina and South Carolina charters, in the State of

Virginia, and with the right to operate in Virginia as of April 23, 1951. The separate entity of the new Virginia Corporation lapsed into the parent company in the merger, effective the same date.

Southern Railway Company acquired 16,710 of the 16,963 of common stock and all 11,000 shares of preferred stock, but not the 95 shares of Common Stock Voting Trust Certificates, of the Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company under a transaction embodied in an agreement dated August 7, 1903 between The Standard Trust Company and William A. Barber, former President of the Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company. However, Southern Railway Company did not register the Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company shares in its name until 1951. Then it did so under ICC authority granted in Finance Docket No. 17158, *Carolina & Northwestern Railway Company Control*, 282 ICC 803 (1951), June 7, 1951. Southern Railway Company acquired three additional shares of the Carolina and Northwestern Railway Common Stock in 1951 and 50 additional shares of the C&NW Common Stock on January 20, 1958.

Under ICC authority granted in Finance Docket No. 17158, *Carolina & Northwestern Railway Company Control*, 282 ICC 803 (1951), June 7, 1951, Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company entered into four leases dated July 1, 1951, until December 31, 2000, subject to termination on six months notice, providing for the combined operation only in its name of the properties. These leases included the lease of the line of the Yadkin Railroad Company between Albemarle, NC and Yadkin Junction (Salisbury) NC.

Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company merged into the old Norfolk Southern Railway Company on January 1, 1974, pursuant to ICC Finance Docket Nos. 27078, 27079.

After the consolidation of Norfolk and Western Railway Company and Norfolk Southern Railway Company as subsidiaries of Norfolk Southern Corporation in 1982, the Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company name was revived and Norfolk Southern Railway Company's name was changed to Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company.

The interchange between NSR and WSSB at Albemarle was terminated on September 11, 1986.

Carolina and Northwestern Railway Company was merged into Southern Railway Company on June 1, 1988. Thus, Southern Railway Company, soon to become Norfolk Southern Railway Company, succeeded directly to the lease of the Yadkin Railroad Company. Yadkin Railroad Company's First Mortgage dated November 7, 1890 was paid off and released in May 1995.

In STB Finance Docket No. 33951, *Norfolk Southern Railway Company - Corporate Family Transaction Exemption - Yadkin Railroad Company*, served December 12, 2000, the Surface Transportation Board served a notice of exemption covering Norfolk Southern Railway Company's renewal of its lease and operation of approximately 30 miles of rail line owned by Yadkin Railroad Company, then a Class III rail carrier and a subsidiary of NSR, located in the State of North Carolina. The parties scheduled consummation of the transaction for a date on or before December 31, 2000.

The extension of the Norfolk Southern Railway Company lease of the Yadkin Railroad Company extends the term of the lease until 2025 with an optional 25-year extension.

In 2004, Norfolk Southern Railway Company acquired the 9.6 per cent of the Yadkin Railroad Company stock that it did not own from Roane County, North Carolina. Thus, Yadkin Railroad Company recently became a wholly-owned subsidiary of Norfolk Southern Railway Company.

Norfolk and Western Railway Company was incorporated by special act of Virginia approved on January 15, 1896, and succeeded, under a plan of reorganization, to the properties of Norfolk and Western Railroad Company, the Lynchburg and Durham Railroad Company (that had been sold first to the Norfolk, Lynchburg and Durham Railroad Company) and the Roanoke and Southern Railway Company (that had been sold first to the Norfolk, Roanoke and Southern Railroad Company). The two companies shown in parentheses were organized on the dates of purchase for the sole purpose of acquiring and transferring the property of the named companies to Norfolk and Western Railway Company.

Norfolk and Western Railway Company's predecessor, Norfolk and Western Railroad Company, was sold at foreclosure September 15, 1896 and conveyed to Norfolk and Western Railway Company, October 1, 1896. Norfolk, Lynchburg and Durham Railroad Company conveyed the property of the Lynchburg and Durham Railroad Company that it had purchased at foreclosure September 16 or 24, 1896 to Norfolk and Western Railway Company on October 6, 1896. Norfolk, Roanoke and Southern Railroad Company conveyed the property of Roanoke and Southern Railway Company (124 miles of line between Roanoke, VA and Winston-Salem, NC) that it

purchased at foreclosure November 24, 1896, together with its rights and franchises, to Norfolk and Western Railway Company on December 2, 1896.

Norfolk Southern Corporation, a non-carrier holding company, was incorporated in the Commonwealth of Virginia on July 23, 1980. Based on an Agreement of Merger and Reorganization, dated July 31, 1980, and eventual Interstate Commerce Commission approval, Norfolk Southern Corporation acquired control of Norfolk and Western Railway Company and Southern Railway Company and their subsidiaries.

On December 4, 1980, Norfolk Southern Corporation, Norfolk and Western Railway Company, and Southern Railway Company filed a joint application to the ICC in Finance Docket No. 29430 (Sub-No. 1), pursuant to which they sought authority under 49 U.S.C. 11343 for Norfolk Southern Corporation to acquire control through stock ownership of Norfolk and Western Railway Company and its subsidiary carrier companies, and of Southern Railway Company and its consolidated system companies.

Under approval granted by the ICC in Finance Docket No. 29430 (Sub-No. 1), *Norfolk Southern Corporation -- Control -- Norfolk and Western Railway Company and Southern Railway Company*, 366 I.C.C. 173 (1982), dated March 19, 1982, Norfolk Southern Corporation acquired control of Norfolk and Western Railway Company and Southern Railway Company on June 1, 1982.

Two books on the Norfolk and Western Railway Company and Southern Railway Company systems provide detailed information on the companies' history and development to the time of the Norfolk Southern consolidation. They are: E. F. Pat Striplin, *The Norfolk And Western: A History* (Roanoke, VA: The Norfolk and Western

Railway Co., 1981) and Burke Davis, *The Southern Railway: Road of the Innovators* (Chapel Hill, NC: University of North Carolina Press, 1985).

Effective December 31, 1990, Southern Railway Company changed its name to Norfolk Southern Railway Company. Norfolk and Western Railway Company became a wholly-owned subsidiary of Norfolk Southern Railway Company rather than a subsidiary of Norfolk Southern Corporation.

Pursuant to a notice of exemption filed in STB Finance Docket No. 33648, *Norfolk Southern Railway Company--Merger Exemption--Norfolk and Western Railway Company*, served August 31, 1998, Norfolk Southern Railway Company merged Norfolk and Western Railway Company into Norfolk Southern Railway Company, effective September 1, 1998.

Norfolk Southern Corporation ("NSC"), parent to Norfolk Southern Railway Company ("NSR"), entered into a Transaction Agreement (the "Conrail Transaction Agreement") among NSC; NSR; CSX Corporation ("CSX"); CSX Transportation, Inc. ("CSXT"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of CSX; Conrail Inc. ("CRR"); Conrail, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CRR; and CRR Holdings LLC, dated June 10, 1997, pursuant to which CSX and NSC indirectly acquired all the outstanding capital stock of CRR. The Conrail Transaction Agreement was approved by the Surface Transportation Board ("STB") in a decision served July 23, 1998 in STB Finance Docket No. 33388, *CSX Corporation and CSX Transportation, Inc., Norfolk Southern Corporation and Norfolk Southern Railway Company - Control and Operating Leases/Agreements - Conrail Inc. and Consolidated Rail Corporation*, and the transaction was closed and became effective June 1, 1999.

Pursuant to the Conrail Transaction Agreement, certain Conrail assets were allocated to Pennsylvania Lines LLC ("PRR"), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Conrail. Furthermore, pursuant to the Conrail Transaction Agreement, PRR's assets, in turn, were leased to and are operated by NSR under the terms of an allocated assets operating agreement between PRR and NSR (the "NSR Operating Agreement") with an original term of twenty-five (25) years from the effective date of June 1, 1999, and two optional renewal terms of five (5) years each. The Conrail Transaction Agreement permitted NSR to operate and to enter into various transactions with regard to the assets allocated to PRR. As a result of the Conrail Transaction, Norfolk Southern Railway Company's rail operations grew to include some 7,200 miles of the Conrail system (predominately the former Pennsylvania Railroad), creating balanced rail transportation in the East to benefit customers and communities alike.

In STB Finance Docket No. 33788, *Norfolk Southern Railway Company--Trackage Rights Exemption--Over North Carolina Railroad Company*, served August 27, 1999, the Surface Transportation Board approved North Carolina Railroad Company's (NCRR) agreement to grant to NSR exclusive local and overhead freight trackage rights over its entire line of railroad between Charlotte and Morehead City, NC. The line extends between mileposts EC-0.0+/- and EC-94.7+/-; mileposts H-0.0+/- and H-129.5+/-; and mileposts 284.0+/- and 376.5+/-, a distance of approximately 317.2 miles in Alamance, Cabarrus, Carteret, Craven, Davidson, Durham, Guilford, Johnston, Jones, Lenoir, Mecklenburg, Orange, Randolph, Rowan, Wake, and Wayne Counties, NC. Under the agreement, NSR is permitted to grant trackage rights to its subsidiaries. NSR or its predecessors had leased and operated the NCRR property since 1871 when

the NCRR line between Goldsboro, NC and Charlotte, NC was leased to The Richmond and Danville Railroad Company. Pursuant to a notice of exemption in STB Finance Docket No. 34396, *Norfolk Southern Railway Company – Corporate Family Transaction Exemption – Atlantic and East Carolina Railway Company*, served October 28, 2003; Norfolk Southern Railway Company (NSR) merged Atlantic and East Carolina Railway Company (AEC) into NSR. NSR thus succeeded to the trackage rights over the portion of NCRR's line between Goldsboro, NC, and Morehead City, NC, which was once the property of the former Atlantic and North Carolina Railway Company subsidiary of the North Carolina Railroad Company.

On June 4, 2003, Norfolk Southern Corporation (NSC), CSX Corporation (CSX), and Consolidated Rail Corporation (Conrail) announced the joint filing of a petition with the STB for approval to establish direct ownership and control by CSX Transportation, Inc. (CSXT) and Norfolk Southern Railway Company (NSR), the railroad subsidiaries of CSX and NSC, respectively, of the two Conrail subsidiaries - New York Central Lines LLC (NYC) and Pennsylvania Lines LLC (PRR) that CSXT and NSR had been managing and operating, respectively, since June 1, 1999 under operating agreements approved by the STB in the 1998 decision. The STB approved the petition, subject to certain conditions, in a decision served on November 7, 2003. The transaction was concluded on August 27, 2004 by the merger of NYC and PRR into CSXT and NSR, respectively. The transaction's effect was to replace the PRR and NYC operating agreements and allow NSR and CSXT to operate the NYC and PRR lines via direct ownership.

Stanley County was formed in 1841 from the part of Montgomery County west of the Pee Dee River. It was named for John Stanly of New Bern (1774-1834), who served several terms in the North Carolina House of Commons and two terms in the United States House of Representatives. Stanley County is home to Morrow Mountain State Park, part of the Uwharrie Mountain range, and two lakes, Lake Tillery and Badin Lake.

Badin Lake located near Badin, North Carolina facilitates a power plant which was originally developed to support a small community and aluminum reduction plant established in 1913 by a French industrialist, Adrian Badin. He established the community as a company town for his reduction plant, a subsidiary of *L'Aluminium Française*. In 1915, prior to project completion, WWI began and the French firm sold the dam and town project to Aluminum Corporation of America (Alcoa), today's current owner. In 1916, a subsidiary of Alcoa, the Tallasse Power Company, began completion of the Narrows Dam project, which was finally done in 1917. The power plant and community were the driving factors of the growth and the development of the railroad in this locality.

Several books have been written about the history of Stanly County, North Carolina, and are available in the Stanly County library, including Sharpe, Ivey Lawrence, *Stanly County USA: The Story of an Area and an Era, 1841-1991*, Media Press, Inc., 1990, 335 p.; *Stanly County Heritage North Carolina Volume I*, published by the Stanly County Historical Book Committee, 2002, 375 p.; Stanly County (N.C.), *Historic Sites Inventory: A Comprehensive Survey of Stanly County, N. C.*, 1977, 99 p.;

Foglia, Virginia Stone., *Albemarle, Stanly County Centennial, 1857-1957: The Bridge*), *From Yesterday--Into Tomorrow, May 11-18, 1957*, 100 p.; and, Buchanan, D. Douglas *Images of America: Stanly County*, Arcadia Publishing, 2000, 128 p.

The change contemplated in the operation of the subject railroad line between North Albemarle and Albemarle, NC is for Norfolk Southern Railway Company discontinue operations over and Yadkin Railroad Company to abandon the subject line of railroad, salvage the track and material and to the extent of its title to the real estate to deal with the right-of-way as ordinary real estate no longer subject to a common carrier obligation. There is no feasible alternative to the abandonment action because there is no revenue or potential revenue from railroad traffic on the line or other income sufficient to cover the costs of ownership, maintenance and operation of the property.

(6) Summary of Documents In Carrier's Possession That Might Be Useful for

Documenting a Structure That Is Found To Be Historic - While plans may be available for the structures on the line, it is most likely that any such plans are standard plans used for the construction of similar structures on the dates of construction.

(7) Opinion Regarding Criteria For Listing In The National Register Of Historic


Places – The railroads' opinion is that neither the structures on the line to be abandoned nor the line itself meet the criteria for listing in the *National Register of Historic Places*. The structures are bridges which are short in length and ordinary in design and construction. There is nothing that distinguishes the bridges from others in


the region. They have no reason to believe that there is any likelihood of finding archaeological resources or historic properties on the line proposed for abandonment.


(8) Subsurface Ground Conditions That Might Affect Archaeological Recovery

– The railroads are not aware of any prior subsurface ground disturbances or environmental conditions that would affect archaeological recovery. Moreover, abandonment of the line and salvage of material from its surface will not affect any potential archaeological resources. The subsurface of the right-of-way was initially disturbed in the construction of the railroad line by grading and filling. Abandonment and salvage of the line will not result in activities below the surface, or below the level of initial disturbance.

(9) Follow-Up Information - Additional information will be provided as appropriate.








