
On July 31, 1997, Conrail filed a petition seeking an exemption under 49 U.S.C. 10502 from the prior approval requirements of 49 U.S.C. 10903 to discontinue service for approximately three years over 2,635 feet of the Boston Terminal Running Track ("Track 61"). The purpose of this temporary discontinuance was to allow for certain construction by the Massachusetts Turnpike Authority in connection with the South Boston Interchange portion of the Central Artery/Tunnel project. By decision served on November 17, 1997, the Board exempted the proposed discontinuance from the prior approval requirements of 49 U.S.C. 10903. The original exemption was scheduled to remain in effect until December 16, 2000. CSX Transportation, Inc. ("CSXT"), the current operator of this line, requested an extension on the discontinuance period which was granted and is scheduled to expire on December 31, 2003.

As of the date of this letter, the construction on the Central Artery/Tunnel project is incomplete. As such, CSXT must request a further extension until December 31, 2004, in order to allow for the completion of the construction. CSXT is agreeable to this extension as a result of an agreement between CSXT and the Turnpike Authority. In the event that the Turnpike Authority fails to abide by the terms of the agreement, however, CSXT reserves the right to reconsider this further extension.
