







JOINT NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

Dallas Area Rapid Transit ("DART") and Dallas, Garland and Northeastern Railroad ("DGNO") hereby file this Joint Notice of Exemption pursuant to 49 C.F.R. § 1152.50 for DART to abandon, and DGNO to discontinue trackage rights over, an approximately 8.85-mile line of railroad in Collin County, Texas. A map indicating the subject rail line is attached hereto as Exhibit A. In accordance with 49 C.F.R. § 1152.50(d)(2), DART and DGNO submit the following information:

Identification of Applicant: 49 C.F.R. § 1152.22(a)(1)-(2)

DART is a political subdivision of the State of Texas charged with developing and operating a public transit system in the greater Dallas area. DGNO is a Class III common carrier by rail that operates over approximately 185 miles of rail line in the State of Texas.

Relief Sought: 49 C.F.R. § 1152.22(a)(3)

Pursuant to the Board's class exemption for the abandonment and discontinuance of service over out-of-service rail lines, codified at 49 C.F.R. § 1152.50(b), DART seeks to abandon a line of railroad between approximately milepost 281.65 near Plano, TX and approximately milepost 290.5 near Allen, TX (the "Subject Line"). The Subject Line was constructed in approximately 1874 by the Houston & Texas Central Railroad as part of a route between Dallas and Denison and eventually came under control of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company ("SPTC"). DART acquired the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 281.5 near Plano Parkway and approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway from the SPTC in 1988 for future use as a public transit corridor. Dallas Area Rapid Transit – Acquisition and Operation Exemption – Rail Lines of Southern Pacific Transportation Company, Finance Docket No. 31267 (ICC served May 20, 1988) (authorizing, inter alia, DART's acquisition of the Ennis Subdivision North Mainline from SPTC between approximately milepost 273.0 at Gifford Junction and approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway).

As part of that transaction, SPTC retained local and overhead trackage rights for a period of not more than five (5) years over the portion of the former Ennis Subdivision North between approximately milepost 273.0 at Gifford Junction and approximately milepost 282.10 at the crossing of the SPTC line and a perpendicular St. Louis Southwestern Railway Company ("SSW") line in Plano. Southern Pacific Transportation Company – Trackage Rights Exemption – Dallas Area Rapid Transit, Finance Docket No. 31270 (ICC served May 20, 1988).¹ In addition, SSW acquired local trackage rights for a period of not more than five (5) years over the same portion of the former Ennis Subdivision North between approximately milepost 273.0 at Gifford Junction and approximately milepost 282.10 at the SPTC-SSW crossing in Plano. St. Louis Southwestern Railway Company – Trackage Rights Exemption – Dallas Area Rapid Transit, Finance Docket No. 31278 (ICC served May 20, 1988).

In 1997, DART, SPTC and SSW jointly obtained an exemption from STB authority to abandon and discontinue freight service over the portion of the former Ennis Subdivision North between approximately milepost 273.0 at Gifford Junction and approximately milepost 281.65 at Plano Parkway in Plano. Dallas Area Rapid Transit – Abandonment Exemption – In Dallas and Collin Counties, TX, STB Docket No. AB-439 (Sub-No. 2X), et al., (STB served May 15, 1997). At that time DART did not seek authority to abandon and SPTC did not seek authority to discontinue its freight operating rights on the remaining portion of the former Ennis Subdivision North owned by DART between approximately milepost 281.65 and approximately milepost 285.1. Also, at that time, Union Pacific Railroad Company ("UP") as a successor in interest to

¹ SPTC retained freight operating rights over the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 282.1 and approximately milepost 285.1.

SPTC, continued to own the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek parkway in Plano and approximately milepost 290.5 near Stacy Road in Allen.

In 1999, DGNO acquired a leasehold interest on the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 285.1 and approximately milepost 290.5 from UP. In addition, DGNO acquired UP's trackage rights over the portion of the Subject Line then owned by DART between approximately milepost 281.65 and approximately milepost 285.1. Dallas Garland & Northeastern Railroad, Inc. – Lease Exemption – Union Pacific Railroad Company, Finance Docket No. 33686 (STB served Feb. 5, 1999).²

In 2001, DGNO acquired a leasehold interest on the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway in Plano and approximately milepost 290.5 near Stacy Road in Allen from UP subject to DGNO's leasehold interest. Dallas Area Rapid Transit – Acquisition Exemption – Lines of Union Pacific Railroad Company, Finance Docket No. 34063 (STB served July 20, 2001).

As a result of the foregoing transactions, DART currently owns the Subject Line, DGNO has trackage rights over the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 281.65 near Plano Parkway and approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway, and DNGO has a lease for freight operations on the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway and approximately milepost 290.5 near Stacy Road in Allen. DGNO no longer provides

² The DNGO notice of exemption and subsequent STB federal register notice in Finance Docket No. 33686 refer to these trackage rights as extending between approximately milepost 281.1 and approximately milepost 285.1. DART believes that the correct southern endpoint of these trackage rights is approximately milepost 281.65 (rather than 281.1) because UP's predecessor SPTC had already obtained STB authority to discontinue its trackage rights between milepost 281.1 and milepost 281.65 in STB Docket No. AB-429 (Sub-No. 2X) et al.

freight rail service on the Subject Line. DART does not at this point use the Subject Line as part of its public transit system, but has plans to do so in the future.

DART and DGNO certify that no local traffic has moved over the Subject Line for at least two years and any overhead traffic on the line can be rerouted over other lines.

In addition, no formal complaint filed by a user of rail service on the Subject Line (or a state or local governmental entity acting on behalf of such user) regarding cessation of service over the Subject Line either is pending with the Board or any U.S. District Court or has been decided in favor of such complainant during the last two years. See Certifications of Thomas Neville (for DART) and Larry Bush (for DGNO), attached hereto as Exhibits B and C, respectively.

Proposed Consummation Date: 49 C.F.R. § 1152.50(d)(2)

DART intends to railbank under the National Trails System Act, and DGNO intends to discontinue its trackage rights over, the Subject Line soon after this Notice of Exemption becomes effective.

Suitability for Other Public Purposes: 49 C.F.R. § 1152.22(e)(4)

The right-of-way of the Subject Line may be suitable for alternative public use under 49 U.S.C. § 10905, including future use as part of a public transit corridor or potential use as a recreational trail. DART has plans to railbank the Subject Line for these purposes.

Notice Requirement: 49 C.F.R. § 1152.50(d)(2), 1105.11

A certificate that the agencies designated in 49 C.F.R. § 1152.50(d)(1) have been served with written pre-filing notice of this abandonment is attached hereto as Exhibit D. A certificate that the Environmental/Historic Report accompanying this Notice of Exemption as Exhibit E has been served on the agencies designated in 49 C.F.R. § 1105.7(b) is attached as Appendix R to that Report.

ENVIRONMENTAL/HISTORIC REPORT

Dallas Area Rapid Transit (“DART”) and the Dallas, Garland and Northeastern Railroad Company (“DGNO”) (the “Applicants”) submit this Environmental/Historic Report (the “Report”) in accordance with the reporting requirements of 49 C.F.R. §§ 1105.7 and 1105.8. It is the conclusion of the Report that the proposed abandonment and discontinuance, if implemented, will not significantly affect the quality of the human environment, the conservation of energy resources, or historically significant or archaeological sites. Supporting correspondence and certifications are attached.

Environmental Report - 49 C.F.R. § 1105.7(e)

1. Proposed Action and Alternatives. DART seeks to abandon its line of railroad between approximately milepost 281.65 near Plano, TX and approximately milepost 290.5 near Allen, TX (the “Subject Line”). DGNO seeks to discontinue its freight operating rights over the Subject Line. The total distance of the Subject Line is approximately 8.85 miles, all within

Collin County, Texas. No local or overhead freight rail traffic of any kind has moved over the Subject Line for at least the past two (2) years.

No alternatives to the proposed abandonment and discontinuance have been considered. The only alternative is retention of the Subject Line in its current, unused state, which would have no environmental impact.

A map showing the location of the Subject Line is attached hereto as Appendix A.

2. Transportation System. The Applicants do not anticipate that existing regional or local transportation systems or patterns will be adversely affected by the proposed abandonment and discontinuance of freight rail service. No freight rail traffic of any kind has moved over the Subject Line for at least the past two (2) years. The Applicants have requested comments from the Texas Department of Transportation. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix B. In addition, the Applicants have requested comments from the North Central Texas Council of Governments that is responsible for developing and maintaining the Metropolitan Transportation System. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix C. To date, no response has been forthcoming. Upon receipt of a response, the Applicants will forward the response to the Board.

3. Land Use.

(i) The Applicants do not foresee any inconsistency with regional and/or local land use plans but have contacted and requested comments from the Collin County Director of Engineering and the Collin County Judge, who are responsible for development/planning functions in Collin County. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendices D and E. To date, no response has been forthcoming. Upon receipt of a response, the Applicants will forward the response to the Board.

(ii) The proposed abandonment and discontinuance will have no adverse impact on prime agricultural land or farmland resources. The Natural Resources Conservation Service (formerly the U.S. Soil Conservation Service) of the United States Department of Agriculture has been advised of the abandonment. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix F. To date, no response has been forthcoming. Upon receipt of a response, the Applicants will forward the response to the Board.

(iii) Not Applicable. The proposed project is not located within the Texas Coastal Management Program boundary. The Texas Coastal Management Division has been advised of the proposed abandonment. The Texas Coastal Management Division has stated that the project is outside the Texas Coastal Management Program (CMP) boundary and it is not subject to consistency review under the Texas CMP. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix L and L-1.

(iv) Upon receipt of abandonment authority from the Board, DART plans to convert the Subject Line into a rail-trail pursuant to the National Trails System Act and in the future may use the underlying right-of-way as part of a public transit corridor.

4. Energy.

(i) The proposed abandonment and discontinuance will not have any effect on the transportation of energy resources. No freight rail traffic of any kind has moved over the Subject Line for at least the last two (2) years, and the Applicants foresee little possibility that new on-line freight traffic would develop in the future.

(ii) The movement and/or recovery of recyclable commodities will not be adversely affected by the proposed abandonment and discontinuance of service. No recyclable commodities have moved over the Subject Line for at least the past two (2) years, and the

Applicants foresee little possibility that any recyclable commodity traffic would develop in the future.

(iii) The proposed abandonment and discontinuance will not result in an increase or decrease in overall energy efficiency. No freight rail traffic of any kind has moved over the Subject Line for at least the past two (2) years.

(iv) Not applicable. The proposed abandonment and discontinuance of service over the Subject Line will not cause the diversion of more than 1,000 rail carloads per year or an average of 50 rail carloads per mile per year to motor carriers. No freight rail traffic of any kind has moved over the Subject Line for at least the past two (2) years.

5. Air.

(i) Not applicable. The proposed abandonment and discontinuance of service will not result in (A) a minimum increase in rail traffic of 100% or eight trains per day on any segment of rail line, (B) an increase in rail yard activity of at least 100%, or (C) an average increase in truck traffic of more than 10% of the average daily traffic or 50 vehicles per day on any road segment.

(ii) Not applicable. The proposed abandonment and discontinuance of the Subject Line will not result in traffic increases that exceed the thresholds specified in 49 C.F.R. § 1105.7(e)(5)(ii)(A),(B) or (C).

(iii) Not applicable. No ozone depleting materials have been transported over the Subject Line for at least the last two (2) years, and no such shipments will be diverted as a result of the proposed abandonment and discontinuance.

The proposed abandonment and discontinuance will not impact air quality standards, significantly increase ozone precursor emissions or require a general conformity analysis. The

Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission and Natural Resources Division of the Office of the Texas Attorney General have been contacted and asked to comment. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendices G and H. To date, no response has been received. Upon receipt of a response, the Applicants will forward the response to the Board.

6. Noise. Not applicable. None of the thresholds identified in 49 C.F.R. § 1105.7(e) (5) (i) will be exceeded as a result of the proposed abandonment and discontinuance.

7. Safety.

(i) No freight rail operations have occurred on the Subject Line for at least the last two (2) years, and thus the proposed action will have no adverse effect upon public health or safety. During any salvage operations on the Subject Line precautions will be taken to maintain public safety.

(ii) Not applicable. No hazardous materials are expected to be transported as a result of the proposed abandonment and discontinuance of service.

(iii) The Applicants are not aware of any hazardous waste sites or sites where there have been hazardous material spills on the right-of-way of the Subject Line. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Texas Environmental Protection Division have been advised about the proposed abandonment and discontinuance. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendices I and J. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency stated that it has no comments. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix I-1. The Applicants have also advised and requested comments from the Natural Resources Division of the Office of the Texas Attorney General. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix H. To date, no response has been forthcoming. Upon receipt of a response, the Applicants will forward the response to the Board.

8. Biological Resources.

(i) No critical habitat or other fish or wildlife resources will be destroyed, altered or affected as a result of the proposed abandonment and discontinuance. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service have been advised of the proposed abandonment. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department advised that review of the project activity as proposed indicates minimal impacts to fish and wildlife resources. The United States Fish and Wildlife Service advised that based on the available information, the described action is not likely to adversely affect federally threatened or endangered species. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendices K, K-1, O and O-1.

(ii) The Subject Line does not pass through any wildlife sanctuary or refuges or any national parks or forests. Accordingly, none will be adversely affected. The Subject Line passes through the western edge of Allen Station Park. The Applicants have contacted and requested comments from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, which indicated that the proposed abandonment and discontinuance would have minimal impact on fish and wildlife resources. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendices K and K-1. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service also anticipates no impact on federally threatened or endangered species. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendices O and O-1.

9. Water. Any water quality effects from the proposed abandonment and discontinuance should be minimal. No bridges over bodies of water will be removed as part of the proposed action. DART does not anticipate discharge of any materials into navigable waters that would require permits under Section 402 and 404 of the Clean Water Act. The proposed action will not have a significant effect on water quality and will be consistent with applicable Federal, State and local water quality standards. Comments have been requested from the United

States Environmental Protection Agency and the Natural Resources Division of the Office of the Texas Attorney General. The United State Environmental Protection Agency had no comment. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendices H and I. The Applicants have also contacted the United States Army Corps of Engineers. The United States Army Corps of Engineers has advised that the proposed action does not require Department of the Army authorization. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendices N and N-1.

The Applicants are unaware of any designated wetlands that would be impacted by the proposed abandonment and discontinuance. DART will not remove or otherwise alter the contour of the roadbed underlying the Subject Line as part of the proposed action, and thus there should be no impact on existing floodplain management. The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission has been contacted for comments and has not responded. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix G.

* * * * *

In addition to the agencies referenced above, the Applicants requested comments from the State of Texas Single Point of Contact in the Office of the Governor. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix M. To date, no response has been forthcoming.

The Applicants also requested comments from the National Geodetic Survey (“NGS”) of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. The NGS of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration advised that three geodetic station markers have been identified that may be affected by the proposed abandonment. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix P and P-1. DART does not intend to disturb any markers as part of the proposed abandonment and will provide appropriate notification to NGS should any relocation become necessary.

Historic Report - 49 C.F.R. § 1105.8(d)

1. Map. A map showing the general location of the Subject Line is attached hereto as Appendix A. A U.S.G.S. topographic map, showing the approximate locations and dimensions of railroad structures that are 50 years old or older and are part of the proposed action, is attached hereto as Appendix A-1.

2. Description of Line. The line to be abandoned extends between approximately milepost 281.65 near Plano, TX and approximately milepost 290.5 near Allen, TX. The total distance of the Subject Line is approximately 8.85 miles, all within Collin County, Texas. The right-of-way of the Subject Line is approximately 100 feet in width. The surrounding land is mainly urban and light industrial, and the topography is generally flat.

3. Photographs. Digital color photographs of railroad structures on or adjacent to the Subject Line that are 50 years old or older, and of the immediately surrounding area, have been submitted to the Texas Historical Commission by letter dated July 20, 2005 from Steve Salin of DART to Lawrence Oaks of the Texas Historical Commission. Color copies of those photographs will be provided to the Board's Section of Environmental Analysis.

4. Information on Structures. DART has determined that there are two bridges on the Subject Line and three other railroad structures within or near the Subject Line right-of-way that are fifty (50) years old or older. An architectural historian retained by DART has made a preliminary determination that the two bridges and at least two of the other railroad structures on or near the Subject Line (the stone dam and stone water tower foundation) are eligible for inclusion in the National Registry of Historic Places.

DART has asked the Texas Historical Commission ("THC") to concur in that eligibility determination, and intends to continue to work with the THC and other interested parties in order to satisfy any obligations that DART may have as a result of this proposed abandonment under

Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. By letter dated August 19, 2005, the Texas Historical Commission concurred in that eligibility determination. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix Q-1. The relevant characteristics of these historic structures are described more fully below.

5. History of Operations.

The Subject Line was constructed in approximately 1874 by the Houston & Texas Central Railroad (“H&TC”) as part of a route between Dallas and Denison and eventually came under control of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company (“SPTC”). DART acquired the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 281.5 near Plano Parkway and approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway from the SPTC in 1988 for future use as a public transit corridor. Dallas Area Rapid Transit – Acquisition and Operation Exemption – Rail Lines of Southern Pacific Transportation Company, Finance Docket No. 31267 (ICC served May 20, 1988)(authorizing, *inter alia*, DART’s acquisition of the Ennis Subdivision North Mainline from SPTC between approximately milepost 273.0 at Gifford Junction and approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway).

As part of that transaction, SPTC retained local and overhead trackage rights for a period of not more than five (5) years over the portion of the former Ennis Subdivision North between approximately milepost 273.0 at Gifford Junction and approximately milepost 282.10 at the crossing of the SPTC line and a perpendicular St. Louis Southwestern Railway Company (“SSW”) line in Plano. Southern Pacific Transportation Company – Trackage Rights Exemption – Dallas Area Rapid Transit, Finance Docket No. 31270 (ICC served May 20, 1988).¹ In addition, SSW acquired local trackage rights for a period of not more than five (5) years over the same portion of the former Ennis Subdivision North between approximately milepost 273.0 at Gifford Junction and approximately milepost 282.10 at the SPTC-SSW crossing in Plano. St. Louis Southwestern Railway Company – Trackage Rights Exemption – Dallas Area Rapid Transit, Finance Docket No. 31278 (ICC served May 20, 1988).

¹ In addition, SPTC retained freight operating rights over the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 282.1 and approximately milepost 285.1.

In 1997, DART, SPTC and SSW jointly obtained an exemption from STB authority to abandon and discontinue freight service over the portion of the former Ennis Subdivision North between approximately milepost 273.0 at Gifford Junction and approximately milepost 281.65 at Plano Parkway in Plano. Dallas Area Rapid Transit – Abandonment Exemption – In Dallas and Collin Counties, TX, STB Docket No. AB-439 (Sub-No. 2X), et. al (STB served May 15, 1997). At that time, DART did not seek authority to abandon and SPTC did not seek authority to discontinue its freight operating rights on the remaining portion of the former Ennis Subdivision North owned by DART between approximately milepost 281.65 and approximately milepost 285.1. Also at that time, Union Pacific Railroad Company (“UP”), as successor in interest to SPTC, continued to own the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway in Plano and approximately milepost 290.5 near Stacy Road in Allen.

In 1999, DGNO acquired a leasehold interest on the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 285.1 and approximately milepost 290.5 from UP. In addition, DGNO acquired UP’s trackage rights over the portion of the Subject Line then owned by DART between approximately milepost 281.65 and approximately milepost 285.1. Dallas Garland & Northeastern Railroad, Inc. – Lease Exemption – Union Pacific Railroad Company, Finance Docket No. 33686 (STB served February 5, 1999).²

In 2001, DART acquired the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway in Plano and approximately milepost 290.5 near Stacy Road in Allen from UP subject to DGNO’s leasehold interest. Dallas Area Rapid Transit –Acquisition

² The DNGO notice of exemption and subsequent STB federal register notice in Finance Docket No. 33686 refer to these trackage rights as extending between approximately milepost 281.1 and approximately milepost 285.1. DART believes that the correct southern endpoint of these trackage rights is approximately milepost 281.65 (rather than 281.1), because UP’s predecessor SPTC had already obtained STB authority to discontinue its trackage rights between milepost 281.1 and milepost 281.65 in STB Docket No. AB-439 (Sub-No. 2X) et. al.

Exemption – Lines of Union Pacific Railroad Company, Finance Docket No. 34063 (STB served July 20, 2001).

As a result of the foregoing transactions, DART currently owns the Subject Line, DGNO has trackage rights over the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 281.65 near Plano Parkway and approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway, and DNGO has a lease for freight operations on the portion of the Subject Line between approximately milepost 285.1 near Spring Creek Parkway and approximately milepost 290.5 near Stacy Road in Allen. DGNO no longer provides freight rail service on the Subject Line. DART does not at this point use the Subject Line as part of its rail transit system, but has plans to do so in the future.

No freight rail traffic of any kind has moved on the Subject Line for at least the last two (2) years. Therefore, no operational changes are anticipated as a result of the proposed abandonment and discontinuance.


6. Engineering Documents. DART does not believe it has engineering drawings in its possession that may be useful in documenting the historic structures on the Subject Line.

7. Historic Criteria. Aside from the historic structures described in Section 4 above, the Applicants are not aware of any other structures on the Subject Line that are of unique character or historical significance or meet the criteria for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. The Applicants also believe that no culturally significant locations, archaeological sites or unique land forms will be affected by the proposed abandonment. The Applicants have contacted and requested comments from the Texas Historical Commission in its capacity as SHPO, which has concurred in DART's eligibility determination regarding the historic structures described in Section 4. See correspondence attached hereto as Appendix Q and Q-1.

8. Ground Disturbance. Based on readily available information in its possession, DART believes that subsurface ground disturbance may have occurred when the Subject Line was constructed. The largely urban and light industrial nature of the area surrounding the Subject Line could adversely affect the archaeological recovery of resources. Access to the Subject Line is good throughout its length.
