**CONSENT MOTION FOR CONTINUATION OF
ABEYANCE OF PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

By its decision served on December 11, 2006, the Board held the procedural schedule in this proceeding in abeyance for a period of 30 days to permit mediation of the parties' dispute pursuant to 49 C.F.R. § 1009.1. With the assistance of the Board-appointed mediators, the parties have reached an agreement that should result in the dismissal with prejudice of the complaint in this proceeding. Although the mediation is now completed, in order to provide time to document the agreement, respondent Grand Trunk Corporation ("GTC") respectfully requests that the Board order that the procedural schedule continue to be held in abeyance through January 31, 2007. Within that time the parties contemplate that Williams Olefins, L.L.C. ("Williams") will file a consent motion for dismissal with prejudice.

Complainant Williams has authorized GTC to represent to the Board that Williams consents to GTC's continuation request.
