RE: Union Pacific Abandonment in Kane County IL, STB Docket No. AB-33 (Sub-No. 284X)

Dear Acting Secretary Quinlan:

This request is filed on behalf of County of Kane, Forest Preserve District of Kane County, St. Charles Park District, and City of St. Charles, all municipal corporations interested in providing recreation trail opportunities and utility service, hereinafter referred to as "proponents."

While not taking a position on the merits of this abandonment, the proponents request issuance of a Public Use Condition as well as a Certificate or Notice of Interim Trail Use rather than an outright abandonment authorization between Milepost 35.13 and Milepost 38.3 near St. Charles, IL.

A. Request for Public Use Condition

Proponent asks the STB to find that this property is suitable for other public use, specifically trail and utility use, and to place the following conditions on the abandonment:

1. An order prohibiting the carrier from disposing of the corridor, other than the tracks, ties and signal equipment, except for public use on reasonable terms. Justifications for this condition are:
 - a. the rail corridor in question crosses a scenic river and can be used to connect multiple regional trail systems, Great Western Trail, Fox River Trail and eventually to the Illinois Prairie Path, as well as four community parks and a forest preserve site in accordance with local and regional plans; and,
 - b. the corridor provides important space for municipal utility access.

The time period sought is 180 days from the effective date of the abandonment authorization. Proponent needs this much time to assemble or to review title information, complete a trail plan, and begin negotiations with the carrier.

2. An order barring removal or destruction of potential trail-related structures such as bridges, trestles, culverts, and tunnels. The justification for this condition is that these structures have considerable value for recreational trail purposes. The time period

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requested is 180 days from the effective date of the abandonment authorization for the same reason as indicated above.

B. Request for Interim Trail Use

The railroad right-of-way in this proceeding is suitable for railbanking. In addition to the public use conditions sought above, proponent also makes the following request:

Statement of Willingness to Assume Financial Responsibility

In order to establish interim trail use and railbanking under section 8(d) of the National Trails System Act, 16 U.S.C. §1247(d), and 49 CFR §1152.29, the parties are willing to assume full responsibility for management of, for any legal liability arising out of the transfer or use of, and for the payment of any and all taxes that may be levied or assessed against the right-of-way owned and operated by the Union Pacific.

The property, known as the St. Charles Industrial Lead, extends from railroad milepost 35.13 to railroad milepost 38.3 near St. Charles, a distance of 3.17 miles in Kane County, IL. The right-of-way is part of a line of railroad proposed for abandonment in STB Docket No. AB-33 (Sub-No. 284X). A map published by Union Pacific depicting the right-of-way is attached.


