Enclosed for e-filing by the Arizona & California Railroad Company (“ARZC”) is a letter from the California Office of Historic Preservation (“CSAHPO”) concluding that “Because there are no historic properties present in the APE, I am able to concur with ‘No Historic Properties Affected’ for the undertaking.” ARZC Respectfully requests the removal of the historic condition.

Pursuant to the decision in this proceeding served on June 30, 2009, abandonment was conditioned on


(1)(a) retain its interest in and take no steps to alter the historic integrity of all historic properties including sites, buildings, structures, and objects within the project right-of-way (the Area of Potential Effect) that are eligible for listing or listed in the National Register of Historic Places until the Section 106 process of the National Historic Preservation Act, 16 U.S.C. 470f, has been completed; (b) report back to SEA regarding any consultations with the California Office of Historic Preservation, Department of Parks and Recreation and the public; and (c) not file its consummation notice or initiate any salvage activities related to abandonment (including removal of tracks and ties) until the Section 106 process has been completed and the Board has removed this condition.

ARZC has not altered the historic integrity of any historic properties. Pursuant to the attached letter from the CASHPO, ARZC has completed consultation with the CASHPO, and by this letter, ARZC is reporting back to SEA as to the consultations with CASHPO. Having complied with the above-quoted condition and received a statement from the CASHPO that there are “No Historic Properties Affected,” ARZC respectfully requests the Board to remove condition 1 that was imposed in the decision served on June 30, 2009.

Thank you for your letter of 25 June 2009 on behalf of the Surface Transportation Board (STB) initiating consultation for the above referenced undertaking in order to comply with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and its implementing regulation at 36 CFR Part 800. With this submittal you have requested I review the information for compliance with Section 106.

As I presently understand it, the undertaking consists of abandonment and salvage of tracks and materials of the Arizona & California Railroad line between Rice and Ripley in San Bernardino and Riverside Counties. As indicated in the Environmental and Historic Report the only structures on the line are culverts.

STB concluded that none of culverts were eligible for inclusion in the NRHP and the line itself does not maintain sufficient integrity.

Because there are no historic properties present in the APE, I am able to concur with "No Historic Properties Affected" for the undertaking.
