ASSIGNMENT

INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION

FOR VALUE RECEIVED, the undersigned, CHEMICAL BUSINESS CREDIT CORP., a Delaware corporation ("CBCC") with its principal place of business at 55 Water Street, New York, N. Y. hereby assigns, transfers and sets over to CHEMICAL BANK, a New York banking corporation ("Chemical"), with its principal place of business at 55 Water Street, New York, N. Y., 10041 and to its successors and assigns, all the right, title and interest of CBCC in and to the following:

(a) a Non Recourse Secured Note dated July 31, 1981, (the "Note"), made by FIRST COMMERCIAL BANK, (the "Debtor"), including without limitation the right to receive all payments thereunder;

(b) the units of railroad equipment (the "Units") described in the Security Agreement (and Schedule A attached thereto, as amended by a Statement of New Mark and Numbers) dated July 1, 1981, (the "Security Agreement"), between the Debtor and CBCC as secured party;

(c) the Lease of Equipment described in Section 1 of the Security Agreement and any other Lease pursuant to which any Unit shall at any time be leased, together with any and all schedules thereto;

(d) all rental, issues, income and profit from the Units; and

(e) the Security Agreement, including without limitation the right to receive any and all payments thereunder.

In furtherance of the foregoing assignment and transfer, CBCC hereby authorizes and empowers Chemical, in Chemical's own name or in the name and as attorney hereby irrevocably constituted for CBCC, to ask, demand, sue for, collect, receive and enforce any and all sums to which Chemical is or may become entitled under this Assignment and to ask, demand, sue for and enforce compliance by the Debtor with the terms and agreements on its part to be performed under the Note and the Security Agreement.


