

NOW, THEREFORE, the Lessor and Lessee do hereby agree that six (6) boxcars, bearing road numbers L&N104706-104710, inclusive, and SBD165007, which have been sold by the Lessee to the Lessor pursuant to a Bill of Sale which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A", shall be leased by the Lessor to the Lessee in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Leasing Agreement dated as of September 18, 1981.
