

INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION

INSTRUMENT OF SATISFACTION AND RELEASE dated as of May 15, 1985 among MERCANTILE-SAFE DEPOSIT AND TRUST COMPANY, as Agent ("Vendor") FIRST SECURITY BANK OF UTAH, NATIONAL ASSOCIATION, as Trustee ("Lessor"), and SEABOARD SYSTEM RAILROAD, INC. ("Lessee") (successor by merger to Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company ("L&N")).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, by a Reconstruction and Conditional Sale Agreement dated as of June 1, 1974 ("Conditional Sale Agreement") among the Vendor, L&N, L&N Investment Corporation and Lessor, the Vendor agreed to sell to the Lessor its interest in the railroad equipment described in Schedule A thereto ("Equipment");

WHEREAS, by a Lease of Railroad Equipment dated as of June 1, 1974 ("Lease") between the Lessor and the L&N, the Lessor leased the Equipment to the Lessee subject to the rights of the Vendor under the Conditional Sale Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Conditional Sale Agreement was filed and recorded with the Interstate Commerce Commission on September 25, 1974 and assigned Recordation No. 7553;

WHEREAS, the Lease was filed and recorded with the Interstate Commerce Commission on September 25, 1974 and assigned Recordation No. 7553-B;

WHEREAS, the Lessee has acquired the Equipment subject as of the date hereof to the Conditional Sale Agreement and Lease; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to execute this Instrument to evidence for the public record the satisfaction and release of all the rights and obligations of the parties under the Conditional Sale Agreement and the Lease.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, it is agreed:

The parties hereto do hereby acknowledge and confirm for the public record the satisfaction and release of all rights and obligations of the parties arising under the Conditional Sale Agreement and Lease.

The Lessee will cause this Instrument to be filed and recorded with the Interstate Commerce Commission pursuant to the provisions of 49 U.S.C. Section 11303.

This Instrument may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which so executed shall be deemed to be an original, and such counterparts together shall constitute but one and the same instrument, which shall be sufficiently evidenced by any such original counterpart.




