This refers to the Loan and Security Agreement (Series G) (the "Agreement") dated as of November 1, 1980, between Union Tank Car Company, 111 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, Illinois 60604 (the "Company") and The Chase Manhattan Bank, N.A., One Chase Manhattan Plaza, New York, New York 10081 (the "Bank"). The Agreement was filed with your office on November 12, 1980, and assigned recordation number 12404.

The Company has prepaid in full the Note issued pursuant to the Agreement and, in accordance with the terms of the Agreement, the Bank has agreed to release all of the collateral from the lien of the Agreement.

Enclosed for recordation is an original and two certified counterparts of a Release dated as of December 28, 1981, which relates to the railroad cars listed in Schedule A attached to the Agreement. The Release is included herewith for recordation to clearly indicate of record that the Bank has assigned to the Company all of its right, title and interest in and to such railroad cars and that the Bank has released such railroad cars from any encumbrance with respect thereto in favor of the Bank.

This Release is executed as of the 28th day of December, 1981, by The Chase Manhattan Bank, N.A., a national banking association having its principal place of business at One Chase Manhattan Plaza, New York, New York 10081 (the "Bank") in connection with the Loan and Security Agreement dated as of November 1, 1980 (Series G) (the "Agreement") between the Bank and Union Tank Car Company, a Delaware corporation having its principal place of business at 111 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, Illinois 60604.

1. Purpose. Pursuant to the provisions of the Agreement, which was recorded with the Interstate Commerce Commission on November 12, 1980, and assigned recordation number 12404, the Company has granted to the Bank a security interest in certain rail cars (such cars being hereinafter referred to as the "Equipment"), to and in favor of the Bank to secure the payment of the note issued under the Agreement. As provided for in Section 2.09 of the Agreement, the Company has prepaid in full the Equipment Note issued under the Agreement and, as provided for in Section 3.03 of the Agreement, has requested that all of the Collateral be released from the security interest created by the Agreement. The purpose of this Release is to clearly indicate of record that the Bank has no further interest in the Equipment listed on Schedule A attached to the Agreement, as amended, it being the intent of the Bank to release all such units of Equipment from any encumbrance of the Bank.


2. Release. The Bank hereby certifies that it has assigned to the Company all of its right, title and interest in and to all of the Equipment more fully described in Schedule A to the Agreement, as amended, and that it hereby releases such Equipment from any encumbrance with respect thereto in favor of the Bank.
