I, as a Missouri State Representative and Majority Whip, am concerned about the competitive effects on Missouri businesses of the proposed acquisition of the Southern Pacific (SP) Railroad by the Union Pacific (UP) Railroad. While I am familiar with the proposed agreement between UP and the Burlington Northern-Santa Fe (BNSF) which is intended to remedy those effects, I am not persuaded that this arrangement will produce effective competition for Missouri rail traffic.

I have reviewed Conrail's proposal to acquire a significant portion of SP's eastern lines in connection with the merger, especially the lines running from Chicago and St. Louis to Arkansas, Texas and Louisiana. I find this proposal to be more appropriate and far more effective in addressing Missouri's concerns. The Conrail proposal calls for ownership of the lines, whereas the UP-BNSF agreement primarily involves the granting of trackage rights. I believe that trackage rights provide only limited benefits and limited guarantees which easily can be lost if railroads disagree over whose traffic has priority and who is in charge of operations on the line. Further, I believe an owning railroad is in a far better position than a renter to encourage economic development activities on its lines.


Finally, I believe Conrail's proposal will ensure that Missouri's rail customers have multiple rail options.



Alderman-Cave Feeds operates grain elevators, feed mills, • and a commercial cattle feedyard in Texas and New Mexico. We ship and receive substantial volumes of milo, wheat, and corn by rail. I have been the President and majority stockholder for Alderman-Cave Feeds for the past 14 years.

Alderman-Cave Feeds has a strong interest in competitive rail transportation between the United States and Mexico. The Laredo/Nuevo Laredo gateway is the primary route for shipments between the two countries for the majority of international traffic. This gateway possesses the strongest infrastructure of customs brokers. It also provides the shortest routing between major Mexican industrial and population centers and the Midwest and Eastern United States.

Our company depends on competition to keep prices down and to spur improvements in products and services. For many years Union Pacific and Southern Pacific have competed for our traffic via Laredo, resulting in substantial cost savings and a number of service innovations. TexMex has been Southern Pacific's partner in reaching Laredo in competition with Union Pacific, as Southern Pacific does not reach Laredo directly.

A merger of Union Pacific and Southern Pacific will seriously reduce, if not eliminate, our competitive alternatives via the Laredo gateway. Although these railroads have recently agreed to give certain trackage rights to the new Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad, we do not believe the BNSF, as the only other major rail system remaining in the Western United States, will be an effective competitive replacement for an independent Southern Pacific on this important route.





I understand there is an alternative that will preserve effective competition for my traffic. TexMex has indicated a willingness to connect with other carriers via trackage rights to provide efficient competitive routes. Trackage rights operating in such a way as to allow TexMex to be truly competitive are essential to maintain the competition at Laredo that would otherwise be lost in the merger. Thus I urge the Commissioners to correct this loss of competition by conditioning this merger with a grant of trackage rights via efficient routes between Corpus Christi and these connecting railroads.



We believe the proposed Union Pacific-Southern Pacific merger is missing an important component, without which it is not in the public interest of our region. That component is UP-SP's sale of its eastern lines to Conrail, a major carrier here in Lake County.

Many of the nearly 4,000 miles of trackage rights that UP-SP plans to "rent" to the Burlington Northern-Santa Fe could be sold to Conrail. Conrail in fact seeks that purchase. It is committed to making that corridor more efficient on the highest quality of track.

This would give Northern Ohio's industries better access to the Gulf and Mexico's important petrochemical, raw materials, manufacturing and commercial markets -- a key public interest argument in favor of an ICC decision that the UP-SP's eastern routes be sold to Conrail.

Our industries need direct service south through Cleveland, Chicago, and St. Louis on the lines Conrail wants to purchase from the UP-SP. As an owner-carrier rather than a "renter", Conrail is the best long range choice.

A second public interest argument is that we want to keep Conrail and the other railroads that serve Northern Ohio strong. Transportation competition means better service and better prices for our companies. It helps us keep our manufacturers, and add new ones.

For those reasons, we in Lake County believe the proposed UP-SP merger as it stands is not in the public interest for Northern Ohio, and needs the sale of the eastern UP-SP lines to Conrail to meet that test.



The Houston area depends heavily on the availability of strong rail service for our local businesses. This letter is to advise the Commission of my view that the proposed merger of the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific railroads will serve the area's interests by strengthening rail service and improving competition.

Houston area shippers will enjoy improved service on many routes following a UP/SP merger. Many Houston area businesses ship to and from the West Coast. A UP/SP merger will allow shippers to use efficient combinations of lines to reach SP's Southern Corridor route. Current service on that route suffers from serious congestion and SP's inability to devote the capital resources to upgrade the facilities on its lines. Following the merger, UP/SP plan to invest capital to expand capacity on the Southern Corridor route. Coordination of rail movements and integration of terminal operations will also help relieve congestion. As a result, Houston, shippers will gain an efficient alternative to the BN/Santa Fe route to Southern California.

We also expect better service for movements to the east, along the Gulf Coast toward New Orleans and other Louisiana points. SP shippers will be able to use UP's line east of Lake Charles, Louisiana. Moreover, under an agreement with UP and SP, BN/Sante Fe will gain a new competitive route between Houston and New Orleans through trackage rights and purchase of much of SP's mainline through Louisiana. BN/Sante Fe will also gain access to chemical plants at several points in the Houston area, including Baytown and Mont Belvieu. The agreement will allow BN/Sante Fe to provide an important new service alternative for Houston shippers on movements along the Gulf Coast and to and from the Southeast.

A merger of the UP and SP should improve equipment supply for our shippers, due to the shorter routes and other operating efficiencies that will result from the merger. The

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combined UP/SP system will have more opportunities to reposition equipment and take advantage of backhaul and triangulation opportunities and different seasonal patters of the UP and SP traffic. Yard consolidations should provide some additional storage-intransit opportunities for chemical shippers.

The merger will preserve competition, and actually increase it. The new operating rights for BN/Sante Fe ensure that points now served only by UP and SP will continue to receive service from two railroads. In addition, they provide Houston shippers with new competitive options for movements through Texas and Louisiana. Especially with new BN/Sante Fe access to points in the Houston area, competition for chemicals and petrochemical traffic will be strengthened. Moreover, a UP/SP merger will allow UP/SP to provide more effective competition with BN/Sante Fe than UP and SP could provide separately. Today, SP's service problems and its financial constraints make it a particularly weak competitor. UP/SP and BN/Sante Fe will both be efficient carriers with extensive route systems, capable of providing a high level of service to Houston shippers. We expect that these two systems will be vigorous competitors. Houston will also continue to have service from other rail carriers, barge operators, and other transportation alternatives, including trucks.

The economy of Houston will benefit from the UP/SP merger. Improved service for our shippers and the availability of strong competitive transportation alternatives will help Houston retain its status as a key business hub and will increase employment opportunities in the Houston area. This will benefit all Houston area citizens and the entire State as well.

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

The Toledo Metropolitan Area Council of Governments (TMACOG) supports the purchase by Conrail of certain southern Pacific Eastern lines as part of the proposed Union Pacific/Southern Pacific merger, and without the Conrail purchase being a part of the ICC's approval of the Union Pacific/Southern Pacific merger, it should not be consummated. Attached is a copy of TMACOG Resolution No. 1995-43 adopted by our Board of Trustees on November 15, 1995 supporting this position.

TMACOG is a voluntary association of local governments in Northwest Ohio and Southeast Michigan serving 800,000 people in a 2,240 square mile area. It is established under Chapter 167 of the Ohio Revised Code and Michigan Public Act No. 7 (Ex. Sess.). The TMACOG Board of Trustees is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), pursuant to 23 United States Code 134 and 49, by the Governor of Ohio in cooperation with local elected officials to carry out the continuing, comprehensive, and coordinated transportation planning process for the Toledo area. As part of this planning process and because Toledo and Northwest Ohio are a major transportation hub, TMACOG has been working with the five railroads serving our region, business and industry, economic development agencies, and the public sector since 1981 in a rail transportation planning process. Rail and multimodal transportation planning are a solid part of our ongoing activities.

The Union Pacific and Southern Pacific are considering merging. TMACOG has carefully evaluated the proposed merger. Its effects on our region and the State of Ohio are important to us. While there may be benefits to the consolidation between these two railroads, it is important from an economic development standpoint that other options and proposals be weighed and considered before any merger approval is given by the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC). TMACOG is not satisfied that the proposed agreement between the Union Pacific and the Burlington Northern/Santa Fe alone, and unto itself, will satisfy our concerns over competition.



Recently, I became aware of a proposal by the Union Pacific to y acquire the Southern Pacific railroad.


