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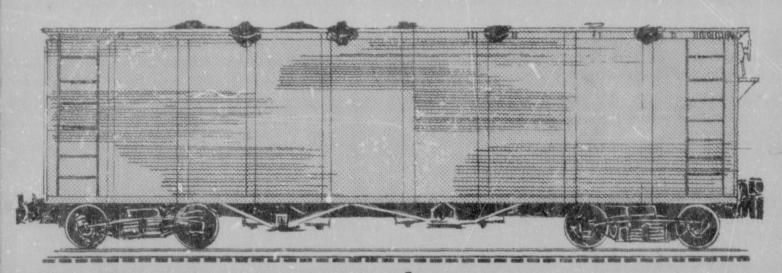

additional time be granted in any case by the Commission.

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other, sport required under the section to be filed. \* \* \* or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be decired guilty of a misdemeation and shall be subject, upon conviction to any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, is a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or comprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and impressionment. \*\*\*\*

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, \* \* \* or any officer, agent, employes, or representative thereof, who shall full to make and tile an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within theiry days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission to 1) do, still forfent to the United States the sum of one hundred deflurs for each and over-day it shall continue to be in default with respect therein.

It). As used in this section " \* " the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" are use a person owning a ratifood, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. \* \* \*

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- 3. Every annual report should, in all particulars, be complete in itslef, and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take he place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically directed or authorized.
- 4. It it be necessary or desirable to insert additional statements, typewritten or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on durable paper and, wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. Inserted sheets should be securely attached preferably in the inner margin, attachment by pins or clips is insufficient.
- 5. All envices should be made in a permanent black ink. Those of a contrary character should be indicated in parentheses. Items of an unusual character should be indicated by appropriate symbol and footnote.
- 6. Money items except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in WHOLE DOLLARS adjusted to accord with footings. Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related p imary accounts.

- 7. Each respondent should make its annual report to this Commission in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for reference in case correspondence with regard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason three copies of the Form are sent to each corporation concerned.
- 8. Raitroad exporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts, and, a lettor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal exist ree and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or riore. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those hoving annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class. Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenue, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as

Class \$1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as usion passenger or fleight stations, stockyards, etc. for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or "ir revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform toth a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Cless \$4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class \$5. Mixed. Communies performing primarily a switching or a breatinal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of reight or passenger teaffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation operations, and operations other than
