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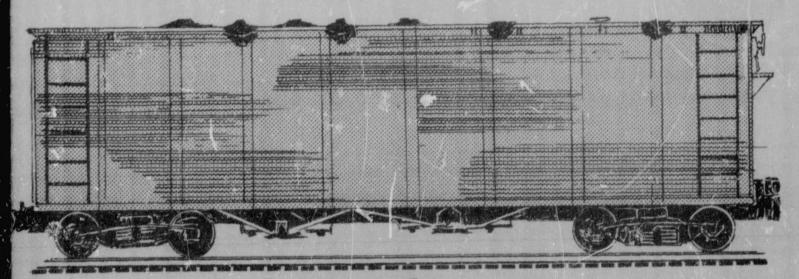

With respect to the term "cars handled" it should be observed that, when applied to switching operations, the movement of a car from the point at which a switching company receives it, whether leaded or empty, to the point where it is leaded or unloaded of delivered to another connecting line is to be counted as one car handled.
