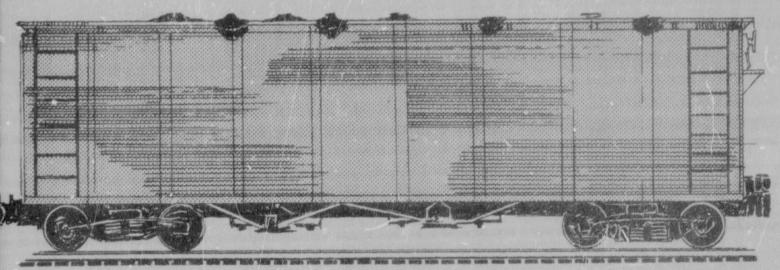

(8) As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a milroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a commor carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor.

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts immediatey opon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to steckholders. See schedule 108, page 6.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operared as a joint facility of owning or tenant railroads, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility tent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and te minal companies are further classified at

- Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of comparies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.
- Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading
- Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above
- Class S4. Bridge and terry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively
- Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation
