

Any person who shall hower and willfully not e, cause to be made, or participally in the making of, any talse or by in any annual of other report required under the section to be filed. \* \* or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any talse report or viber document, shall be deemed guity of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand doctars or impresonment. \*\*\*

(7) (c) Any carrier of lessor, \* \* \* or any officer, agent, employee, re representative thereof, ho shall fail to make and file an angual or other report with the Commission within the Gane fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall furfer to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section " \* " the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a realroad, a water line, or a pipe line; leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. " " "
