

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been gaswered in a previous annual report or not. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions.

Class a companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are these having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Forai & S. is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenar, railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and arminal companies are further classified as:

Class St. Exclusively switching. The wass of companies includes all those performing outcome service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class \$2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies is lucles all companies furnishing reminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyerds, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, is should be measure under this heating.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Jiridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to Aridges and Jerries exclusively.

Cass S5. Mixed. Companies performing originally a switching or a terminal service, but which also consuct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those detived from local passenger service, local freight service, forecognism in Orionga movement of freight or passenger traffic other transportation operations and operations other than transportation.
