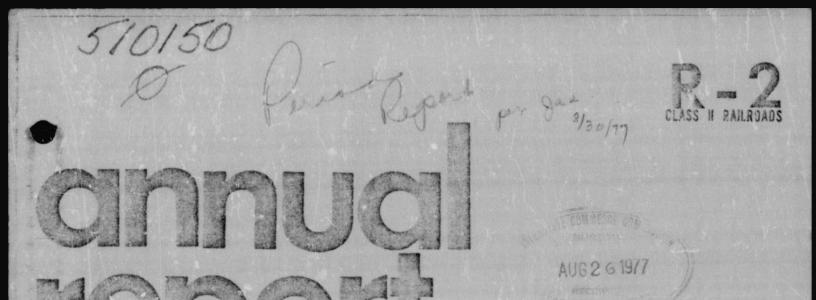
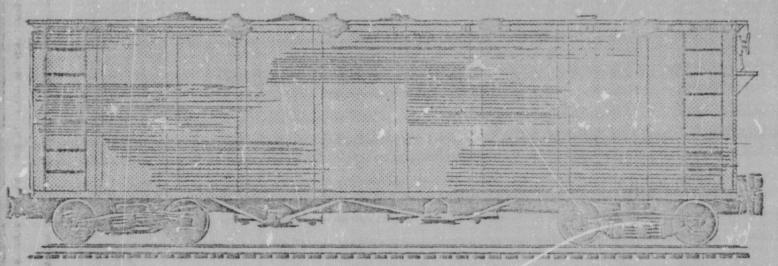

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000, or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000 000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a join vacility of owning or tenant railroads, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility tent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class \$2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing term not trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue, in case a bridge or ferry is a partial the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and lerry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

The Company is a member of an affiliated group filing consolidated federal income tax returns. Because intragroup dividends are eliminated from taxable income, 85% of dividends received from companies outside the group are deductible, and other factors, there is no predictable relationship between the Company's future earnings and its future Federal income tax accruals. Moreover, substantial net operating losses have been reported in Federal income tax returns for prior years which are available as offsets to future income, and at this time there is still available to the Company, and to the former The Pennsylvania Railroad Company and its affiliated companies the election to adopt guideline lives for depreciable property for 1962 and subsequent years, thereby increasing operating loss carryovers. No final determination has been made of the group's tax liabilities subsequent to 1953. In the case of the former New York Central Railroad Company, which became a member of the group effective with the date of the merger, February 1, 1968, no final determination has been made of its Federal income tax liability for years subsequent to 1955. The Statute of Limitations bars any deficiencies in tax for the former New York Central or its affiliated companies for years prior to short period (January 1 to January 31, 1969) although adjustments may be made to the net operating loss carryovers.

On June 21, 1970, Penn Central Transportation Company (PCTC), this Company's parent went into reorganization under Section 77 of the Bankruptcy Act. The extent, if any, to which the PCTC reorganization proceedings will ultimately affect the accounts of this Company is indeterminable.

On December 17, 1976, (as amended May 9, 1977), the Trustees of the Penn Central Transportation Company submitted to the Reorganization Court a Plan of Reorganization for that company. The Plan of Reorganization contemplates that the creditors, other claimants and stockholders of PCTC and certain leased lines compromise their claims in light of the uncertainties of the future in order to obtain recoveries promptly and in order to avoid the expense and delays of prolonged and complex litigation.

The Company has a pension plan which provides retirement benefits for substantially all management employees and certain personnel covered by labor union agreements. It is the policy of the Company to fund pension costs accrued, and at December 31, 1976, the plan was substantially fully-funded for past service. Accounting for pension costs is consistent with prior years.

NOTES AND REMARKS

Conveyance of Assets to Conrail

Pursuant to the Regional Rail Reorganization Act of 1973, as amended (Act), a United States government corporation named United States Railway Association (USRA) was formed. It developed and issued a Final System Plan which, among other things, designated for conveyance to Consolidated Rail Corporation (Conrail) some of the rail and rail-related assets of the Company. In accordance with orders of the Special Court created by the Act, 1.54 miles of the Company's road designated by USRA were conveyed on April 1, 1976.

USRA has indicated to the Special Court a net liquidation value of \$53,930 for the properties conveyed and the following securities have been deposited with the Special Court: 2,716 shares of Conrail's Non-Optional Preferred "B" Stock and one Certificate of Value for each share of Series "B" Stock.

The redemption value of the certificates of value (which are redeemable in cash on December 31, 1987, unless previously redeemed) is to be determined pursuant to a formula contained in the Act. The amounts of certain components of the formula will depend upon future determinations of the Special Court. For this reason, it is not feasible to state what redemption value, if any, the certificates will have.

Since the Act provides for certain deductions from net liquidation value in arriving at the compensation to be paid for the assets transferred to Conrail, it cannot be assumed that the net liquidation value specified by USRA is the minimum amount which the Special Court will award as compensation for the Company's property which was conveyed.

The Special Court is to determine, among other things, the net liquidation value of the assets conveyed on April 1, 1976, the value of "other benefits" provided under the Act to the persons whose properties were conveyed, and the "compensable unconstitutional erosion, if any," which occured during the PCTC reorganization proceedings ("Valuation Case").

In addition, the Special Court is authorized by the Act to reallocate among the claimants the securities deposited in the Special Court, or to order Conrail to issue more securities, or to enter a judgment against Conrail if it would not endanger its viability or solvency, or to enter a judgement against transferees other than Conrail, or to order the return to Conrail or others of securities or money they deposited in the Special Court in exchange for the properties conveyed to them.

Penn Central Transportation Company's rail assets were also conveyed to Conrail for securities of Conrail and Certificates of Value of USRA with an indicated value considerably less than what the Penn Central Transportation Company's Trustees believe to be fair and equitable compensation.

The Company has not agreed to the liquidation value placed on its assets by USRA.

The Company has approximately 50 miles of road remaining (undepreciated value of \$310,837) of which approximately 21 miles is available for subsidity pending agreements with various state and local authorities, and 29 miles will be abandoned.
