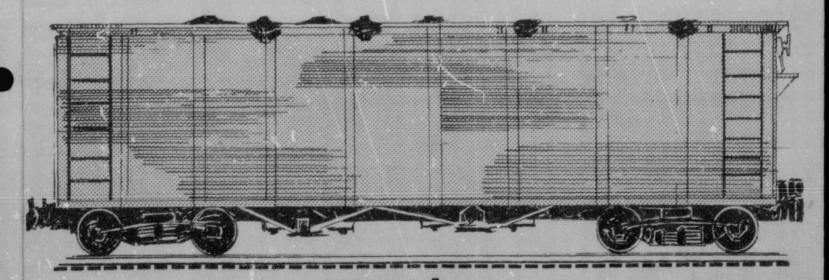

Sec. 20. (1) The Commission is hereby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special reports from carriers, lesssors, * * * tay defined in this section), to prescribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lessors, specific and full, true, and correct answers to all questions upon which the Commission may deem information to be necessary, classifying such carriers, lessors, * * * as it may deem proper for any of these purposes. (2) Said annual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of twelve months ending on the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made out under each and fried with the Commission at its office in Washington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time be granted in any case by the Commission.

(7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and wriffully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be * or shall knowingly or we lfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment.

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor. * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do shall forfer to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto

(8). As used in this section " " " the 'critical means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this pair, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor.

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts. immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts, and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate begal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

> Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Keport Form R-2 is provided
