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

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any faise entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, " or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any faise report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the Unit of States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment: " or (1) (c). 3. Every annual report should, in all particulars, be complete in itself, and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take the place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically directed or authorized.

- 7. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating cornpanies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts; and, a

lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form E.

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form A is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below 5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form C is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined abov

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

8. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below



### DEBTOR WARRANTS AND AGREES AS FOLLOWS:

1. To pay and perform all of the obligations secured by this agreement according to their terms.

2. To defend the title to the collateral against all persons and against all claims and demands whatsoever, which collateral is now free and clear of any and all liens, claims, charges, encumbrances, taxes and assessments, except as permitted by the

Authorization granting the loan.

3. On demand of the secured party to do the following: furnish further assurance of title, execute any written agreement or do any other acts necessary to effectuate the purposes and provisions of this agreement, execute any instrument or statement required by law or otherwise in order to perfect, continue or terminate the security interest of the secured party in the collateral and pay all costs of filing in connection therewith, and the debtor herein authorizes the secured party to file, pursuant to the UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE, one or more financing statements, signed by the secured party, and without requiring the signiture of the debtor, whenever filing is deemed by the secured party to be necessary or desirable.

4. To retain possession of the collateral during the existence of this agreement and not to sell, exchange, assign, loan, deliver, lease, mortgage or otherwise dispose of same

(iii) False or misleading representations or warranties made or given by the debtor in connection with this agreement.

(iv) Subjection of the collateral to levy of execution or other judicial process.

(v) Commencement of any insolvency proceeding by or against the debtor.

(vi)Death & debtor.

(vii) Any reduction in the value of the collateral or any act of the debtor which in the sole discretion of the secured party imperils the prospects of full performance or satisfaction of the debtor's obligation herein.

Upon any default of the debtor and at the option of the secured party, the obligations secured by this agreement shall immediately become due and payable in full without notice or demand and the secured party shall have all the rights, remedies and privileges with respect to the repossession, retention and sale of the collateral and disposition of the proceeds as are accorded by the applicable sections of the Uniform Commercial Code respecting "Default".
