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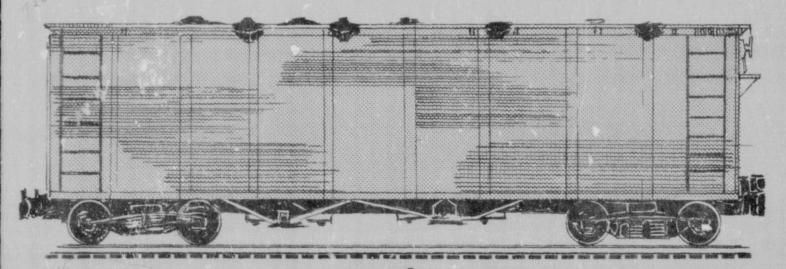

1. This Form for annual report should be filled out in triplicate and two copies returned to the Interstate Commerce Commission, Bureau of Accounts, Washington, D.C. 20423, by March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part 1 of the Interstate Commerce Act:

Sec. 20. (1) The Commission is hereby authorised to require anosal, periodical, or special reports from carriers, lessors, * * * (as defined in this section), to prescribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lessors, * * * specific and full, true, and correct answers to all questions upon which the Commission may deem information to be necessary, classifying such carriers, lessors, * * * as it may deem proper for any of these purposes. additional time be gracted in any case by the Commission

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, " " or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five accusand deliars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment ""."

(7) (c) Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall commission to be in default with respect to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall commission to be in default with respect to the continue.

(8) As used in this section * * * the term 'carrier' means a common carriet subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person invaring a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. * * *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- 2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based on a preceding inquiry in the present report form is, because of the answer rendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made, such notation as "Not applicable; see pageschedule (or line) number---" should be used in answer thereto, giving precise reference to the portion of the report showing the facts which make the inquiry inapplicable. Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broat classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to a following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided

Class \$4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations limited to bridges and ferries exclusively

Class S5. Mixed, Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but wf also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic.
