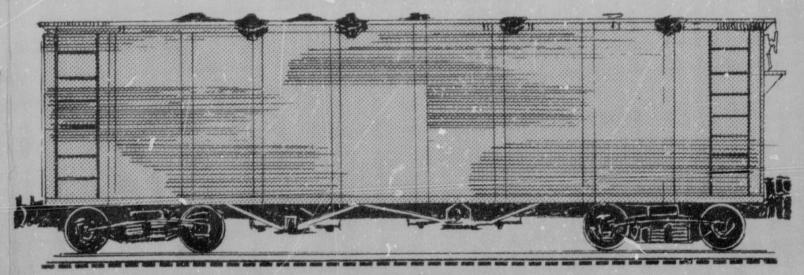

Class 53. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a erminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above

Class \$4. Bridge and feery. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are finited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class \$5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight of passenger traffic.
