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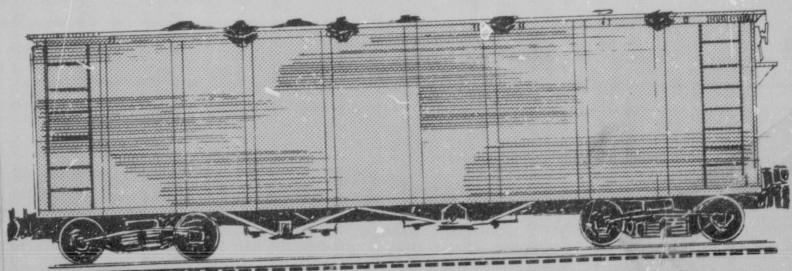

(7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or narricipate in the making of, any false earry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. * * * or shall knowingly or willfully tide with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon convection in any court of the United States of conjectent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than live thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years or both such fine and many courts.

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, " " or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and five an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirry days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shell forfest to the United States the som of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to the pert, and includes a receiver or crustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a pura-owning a rollroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common earlier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and occurately, whether it has been answered in a previous a nual report or nbt. In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

xhass S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

tass \$2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, in ackyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a pact of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are finited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The reveaues of this class of companies include, an addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.
