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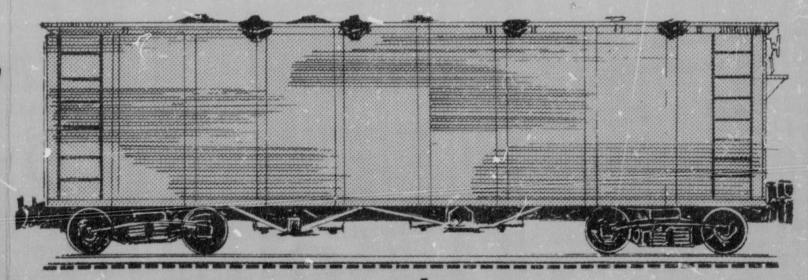

Any carrier of lessor. 1 4 that am officer, agent, employee of representative. thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do. shall forfert to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereio

(8). As used in this section 1. * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts. immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions a this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should he answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. 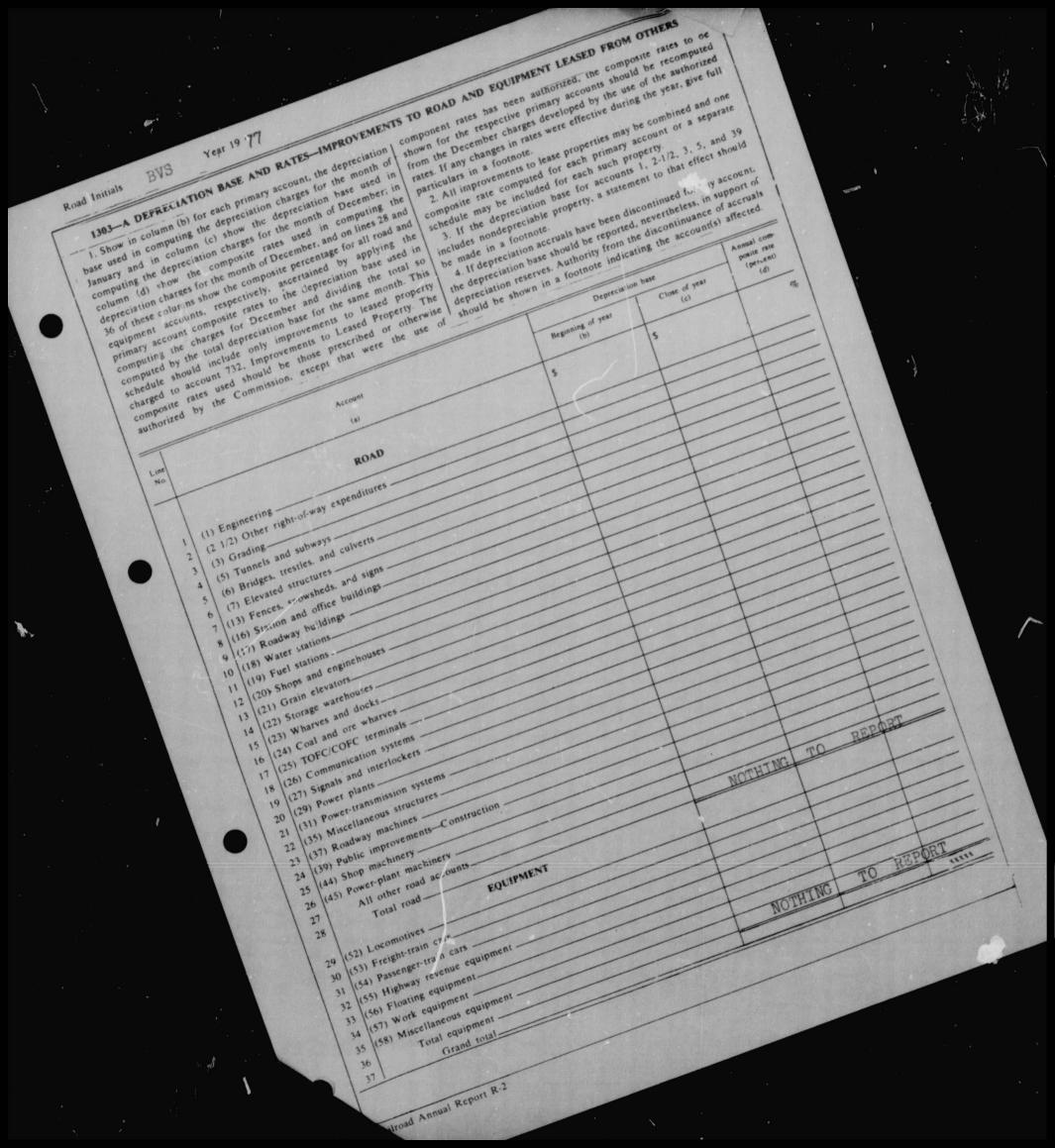
