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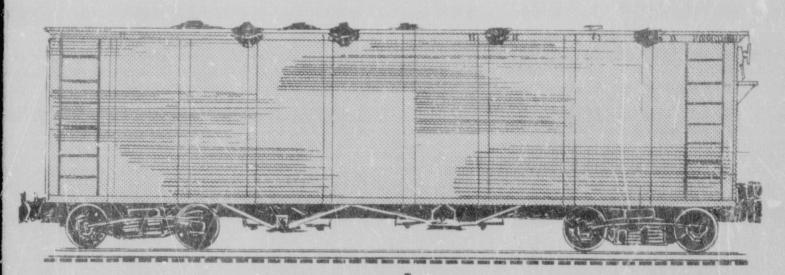

Any carrier or lesson, * * * or any officer, again, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an anian, or wher report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or what specific and full, rue, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one handred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section " " " the term carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver of trustee of such carrier, and the term "less/r" means a person owning a railroad, a way, roue, or a pipe line lessed to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. " "

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

- Every annual report should, in all particulars, be complete in itslef, and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take the place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically directed or authorized.
- 4. If it be necessary or desirable to insert additional statements, typewritten or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on durable paper and, wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. Inserted sheets should be securely attached preferably at the inner margin; attachment by pins or citips is taxufficient.
- 5. All entries should be made in a permanent black ink. Those of a contrary character should be indicated in patentheses. Items of an unusual character should be indicated by appropriate symbol and footnote.
- 6. Money items except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in WHOLE DOLLARS adjusted to accord with footings. Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related primary accounts.

- 7. Each respondent should make its annual report to the Commission in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for roterence in case correspondence with regard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason three comes of the Form are sent to each corporation concerned.
- 8. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts, and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps tinancial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II composes we loose having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Forpi R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used to determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class 5. Exclusively switching. This class of company includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for resenue.

Class \$2. Exclosively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or feroinal facilities only such as union passenger or fleight cattoric, stockyords, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a past of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be uncluded under this heading.

Class 53. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing paymatily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traine. The revenues of this class of companies include in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, becalf reight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and increations other bars transportation, operations, and increations other bars transportation.

Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RESPONDENT means the person or corporation in whose tehalf the report is made. THE YEAR means the year ended December 3. for which the report is made. THE CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made, or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of twiness on January 1 of the year for which the report is made, or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year exil preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM System in Part 1201 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.
