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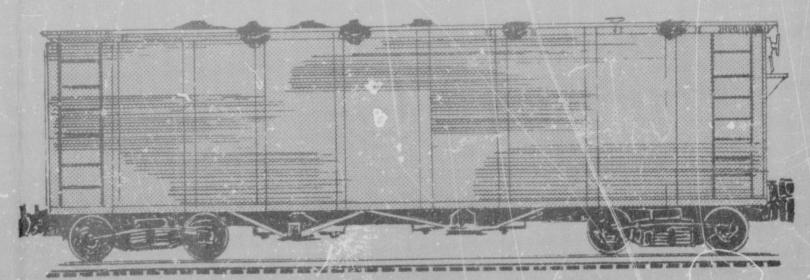

(7) (c) Any carrier or lessot. * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer in any question within thirty days from the sime it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do shall forfer to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section. * * the term carrier means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term lessor means a person owning a railroad, a water line or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. *

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be unswered jully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks. and the like should not be used either as part of or as entire answers to inquiries. An operating company is one waose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts, and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form 8-1 is provided.

Cass II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating tevenues, the joint facility rent ancome, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classed as:

Class \$1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal stackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc. for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue in case a bridge or terry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

t lass S4 Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are hinned to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class 55. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger teathe. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic other transportation operations, and operations other transportation.
