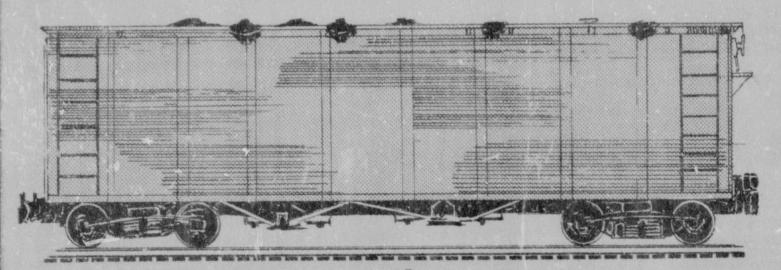

Payments of \$20,000 or more to organizations maintained jointly by railways with other railways are not to be excluded even if their services are regarded as routine.
