The Examiner's report which became the report of the Commission by operation of law approving the application in Section 5a #72 states at pages 2 and 3:

"The proposed agreement is unique. There are no by-laws, organization charter, quorums, permanent officers, nor any schedule of dues nor charges to members. Broadly stated, its sole purpose is to provide a forum for the discussion and exchange of ideas between numerous member motor common carriers, as well as to afford opportunities for shippers throughout the country to make known their views with respect to interterritorial rate matters affecting them, without taking a chance that in so doing they would run afoul of the federal antitrust laws.

" * * * Within 5 days after the conclusion of the meeting, the secretary shall cause a report of recommendation(s) made, if any, to be transmitted to those present and to all persons who have requested notice. The recommendations, advisory only, shall be further processed by each individual motor carrier bureau in accordance with its territorial section 5a agreement, wherein, as well as in Agreement No. 72 (Article IV) the right of independent action of each motor carrier is preserved. * * *"

Because of the situation thus accurately described and as more fully explained in the application itself and at the hearing before the Examiner, any pertinent information respecting organizations handling recommendations arising through the channels of the instant 5a procedures will be submitted to the Commission in the annual reports of the bureaus whose officials served as agents and attorneys-in-fact in the filing and presentation of the instant agreement.
