

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, * * or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission outling the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do. shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in detault with respect thereto.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.


