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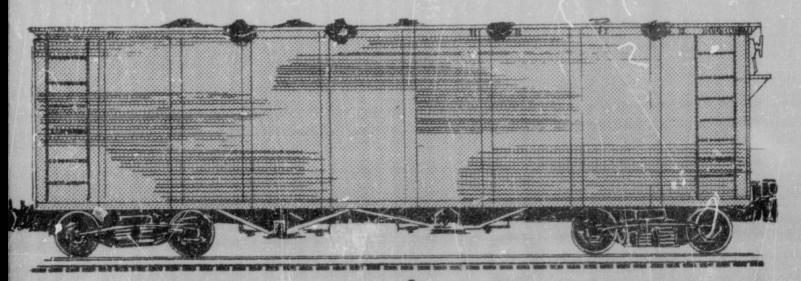

(7) (b) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under this section to be filed. * * * cr shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guity of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any

fars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. * * *

(7) (c) Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any officer, agent, employee or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the f. mmission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirry days from the time it is hawfull required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one huncred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with

(8) As used in this section * * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or bustee of such carrier; and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a ripe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See schedule 108, page 6.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. If it be necessary or desirable to insert additional statements, typewritten or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on durable paper and, wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. Inserted sheets should be securely attached, preferably at the inner margin; attachment by pins or clips is insuf-
- All entries should be made in a permanent black ink. Those of a contrary character should be indicated in parenthesis.
- Money items, except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in thousands of dollars adjusted to accord with footings. Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related primary accounts. For purposes of rounding, amounts of \$500 but less than \$1,000 should be raised to the nearest thousand dollars, and amounts of less than \$500 should be lowered.
- 7. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lesser companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts;

and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not overating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000, or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railroads, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

- Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue
- Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.
- Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a swit-aing and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above
- Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a legular freight o. passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of treight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation

8. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. Respondent means the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. The YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. THE CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. THE UNIFORM SYSTEM OF ACCOUNTS FOR RAILROAD COMPANIES means the system of accounts in Part 1201 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.

NOTES AND REMARKS

We handle a substantial amount of transit cotton billed from Fairfax, Ala., on our line to other stations on our line. Often the paid in rate to Fairfax is the same as the through rate to the final destination so there is no freight on the waybill. Our statistics, therefore, show this as "non-revenue" tonnage. Since, however, because of transit, the shipment from original point of shipment to final destination is treated, insofar as rates and divisions are concerned, as one through shipment I have included such tonnage as "revenue" tonnage in line 22 above and line 25 above. This accounts for the difference between line 22 above and line 37, Col (d), Page 35.
