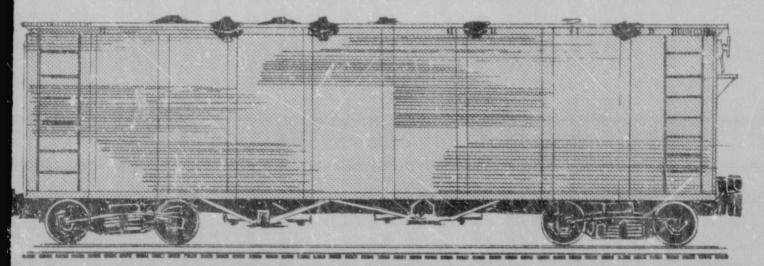

Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, " " or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any talse report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of compete/t jurisdiction, to the of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisons but " "."

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, * * * or any offset, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file to annual or other report with the Commission within the time freed by the Commission, or to make specific and fail, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hencred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be to default with respect thereto.

(8) As used in this section * * the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this

As used in this section " " " the term "carries" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "test of mean a person owning a railroad, a water line, if a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to the part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. " "

An operating company is on whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books outain operating as well as financial accounts, and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies in those laying annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form Roll is provided.

class. Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II comparies at those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class. Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual tailway operating revenues, the joint facility reat income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account of for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies farnishing

Class \$2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies farmishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revonue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this here up.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a territoral service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or possenger traffic. The reveaues of this class of companies include, in action to whiching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local reight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations and operations other than transportation.

9. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RESPONDENT treams the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made. The year means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. The year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. The BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of bisiness on January 1 of the year for which the report is made; in, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the reginning of the period covered by the report. The PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31. The vear next preceding the year for which the report is made. The Uniform System in Part 1201 of Title 49. Coste of Federal Regulations, as antended.
