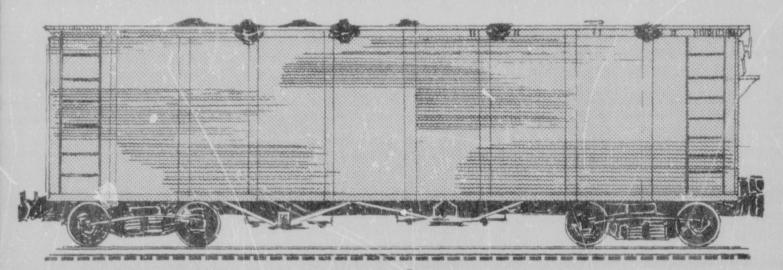

Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, \* \* \* or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any talse report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemean of and shall be subject, upon consistion in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprantment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. \*\*\*

Any carrier or lessor, \* \* \* or any officer, agent, imployed, or representative thereof, who shall fait to make and file an angular or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within party days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission to to do, shall fortest to the United States the sum of one hundred declars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect therein.

(8). As used in this section \* \* \* the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line, lessor to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor. \* \* \*

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau. I Accounts immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based on a preceding inquiry in the present report form is, because of the answer tendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made, such notation as "Not applicable; see page——, should be used in answer thereto, giving precise reference to the portion of the report showing the facts which make the inquiry inapplicable. Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I can panie: are those having annual operating revenues in \$5,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class If companies are those having unnum operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class, it small Report Form R.2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the roturns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal comprines are further classified as

Class Si. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint occusion or for revenue.

Class \$2. Eachedvely terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal inchage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, site, for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. Class \$3. Host switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operation, cover forth switching and terminal service, as defined above.
