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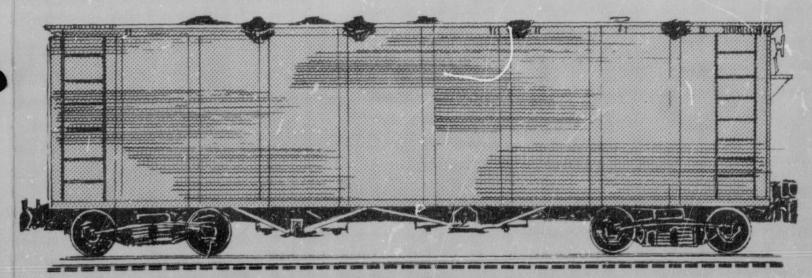

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class St. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue

Class \$2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal commany, it should be included under this heading

Class \$3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class \$4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM System in Part 120i of Title 49. Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.
