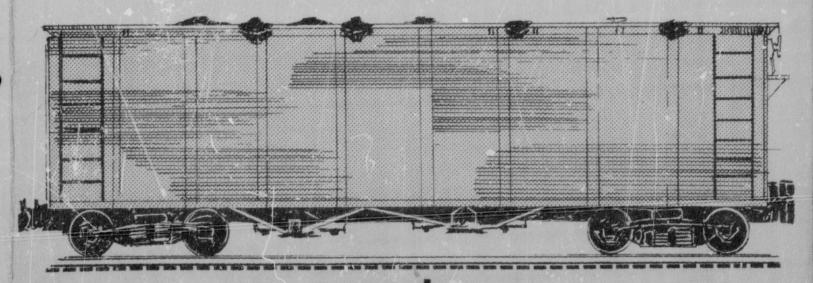

Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed, \* \* \* or shall knowingly or willfully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than tive rhousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment \*\*\*

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, \* or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who shall full to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within thirty days from the fine it is fawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the six of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000 or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class S). Exclusively sweeping. This class of companies includes all those performing sweeping service only, when or for joint account or for revenue.

Class 52. Explusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations stockyards, etc. for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Built owitching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridge, and ferries exclusively.

Class 55. Mixes. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, becalfreight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.
