The Ogdensburg to Dekalb Junction line was built in 1868 by the Rome, Watertown & Ogdensburg Railroad Co. The Norwood to Waddington line was built 1901 - 1909 by the Norwood - St. Lawrence Railroad Co. The St. Lawrence Railroad became a division of National Railway Utilization Corporation under an operating agreement dated March 31, 1977 with Codensburg Bridge & Port Authority & the New York State Department of Transportation.

Note B
