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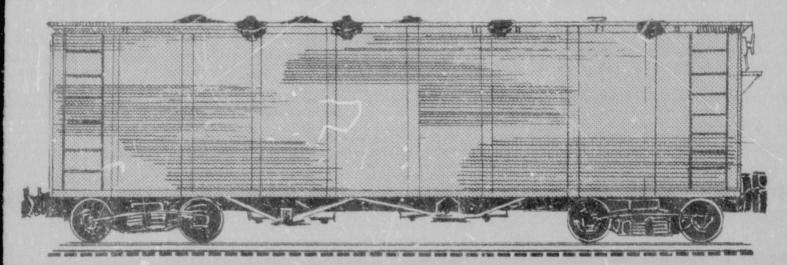

(7) (h). Any person who shall knowingly and wn'fully make, cause to be made, or participate to the making of any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be titled. \* \* \* or shall knowingly or wiffully file with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed quilty of a miscemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of nor more than five thousand dellars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. \*\* \*

(7) (c). Any carrier or lessor, \* \* \* or any officer, agent, employee, or representative thereof, who chall fail to make and file an unusal or other report with the Commission with a the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to day questio within thirty days from the time it is awfully required by the Commission so to fix, shall force to the United States the sum of one united dollars for each and every day it shall continue to be in default with respect thereto.

(8). As used in this section \* \* \* the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water line, or a pipe line; leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or tousier of such leason. \* \* \*

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

2. The instructions in this Form should be carefully observed, and each question should be answered fully and accurately, whether it has been answered in a previous annual report or not. Except in cases where they are specifically authorized, cancellations, arbitrary check marks, and the like should not be used either as partial or as entire answers to inquiries. If any inquiry, based on a preceding inquiry in the present report form is, because of the answer rendered to such preceding inquiry, inapplicable to the person or corporation in whose behalf the report is made, such notation as "Not applicable; see page-" should be used in answer schedule for line) numberthereto, giving precise reference to the portion of the report showing the facts which make the inquiry inapplicable. 6. Money items except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in WHOLE DOLLARS adjusted to accord with footings Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related primary accounts.

7. Each respondent should make its annual report to this Commission in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for reference in case correspondence with regard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason three copies of the Form are sent to each corporation concerned.

8. Railroad corporations, mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as figure a accounts, and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more. For this class. Annual Report Form R-1 - one-yided.

Class II communer are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying vis classification to any switching or terminal company which is ope ared as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class SI. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all these performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class S2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockly, ds. etc. for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or fetry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.

Class S3. Both swin/Sing and ferminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal service. This cass of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class \$4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are

Class \$5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger teaffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

9. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. Respondent means the person or corporation in wrose behalf the report is made. The year means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. The CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on December 31 of the year for which the report is made: or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. The beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made: or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. The preceding year means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. The Uniform System in Part 1201 of Title 49. Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.
