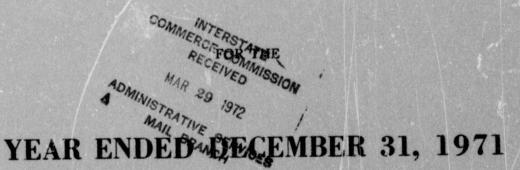

The total amount of Stock, including such decrease, actually paid in is the sum of \$ 650,000. authorized March 20, 1968.

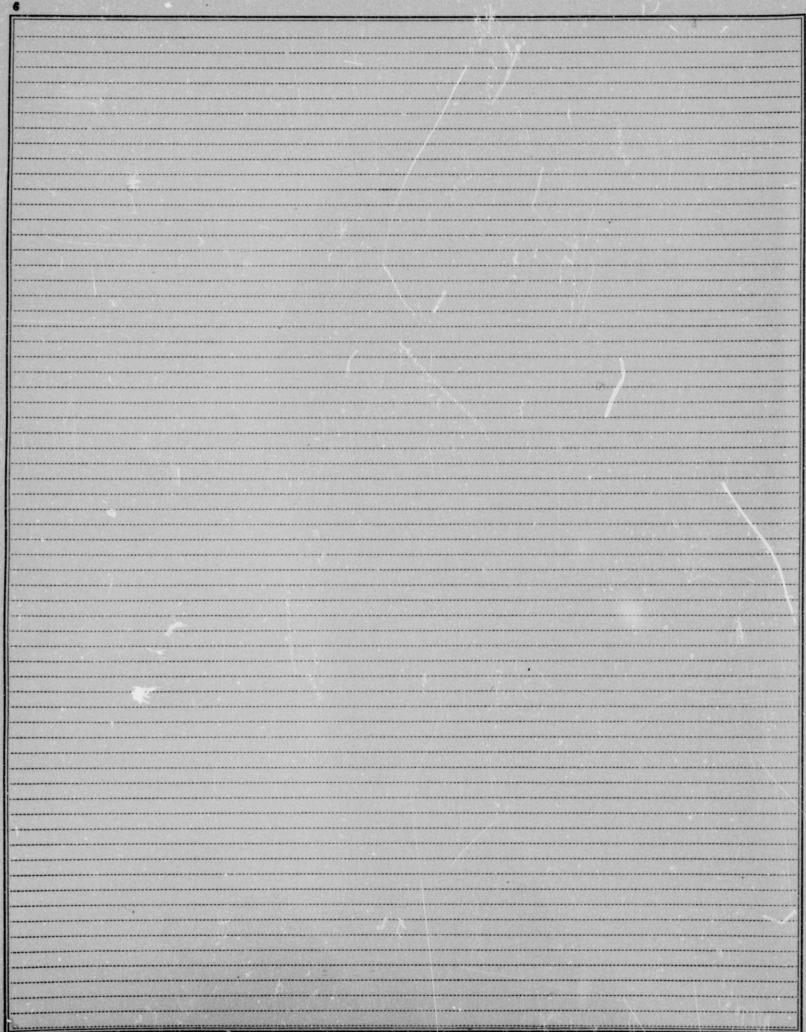
