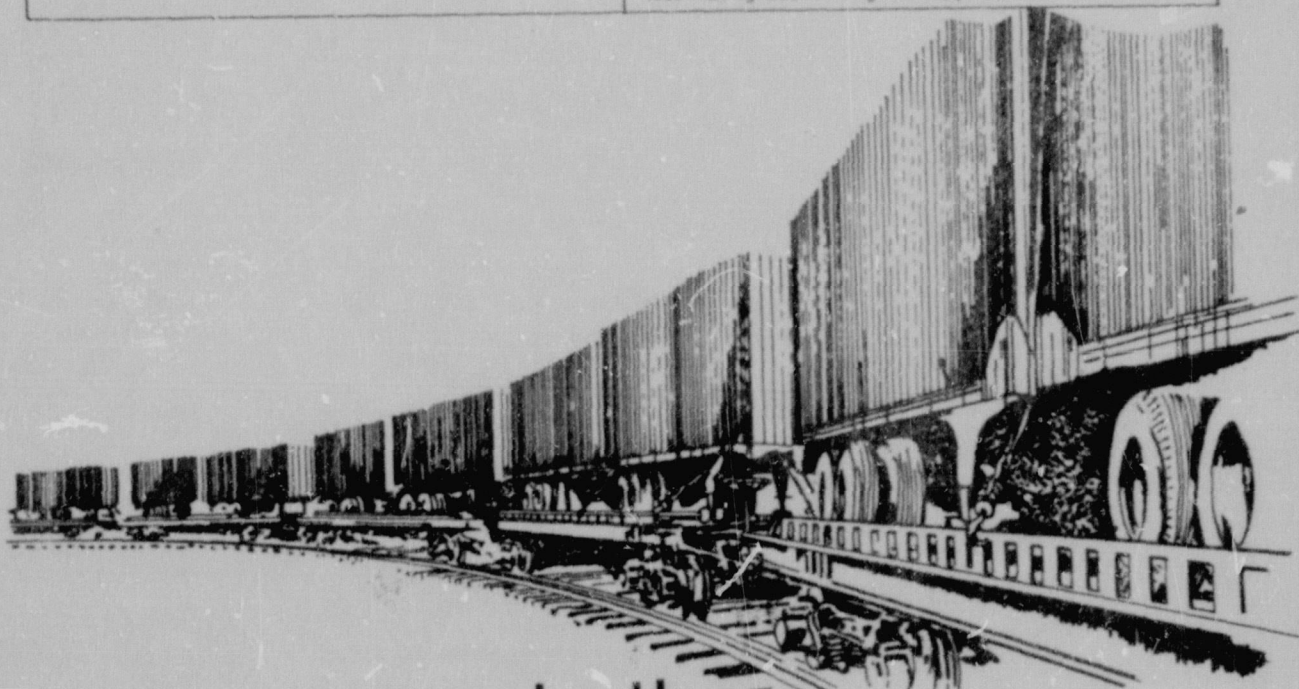

This company had its inception by the purchase of the CF&N Railway (then operating from Apex to Dunn, N. C.) and the construction of a line of road from Apex to East Durham, N. C. The purchase price of the CF&N Railway was \$800,000. The construction of the line from Apex to East Durham was financed by the sale of \$750,000 40-year Gold Bonds @ 4% which were retired in 1912.
