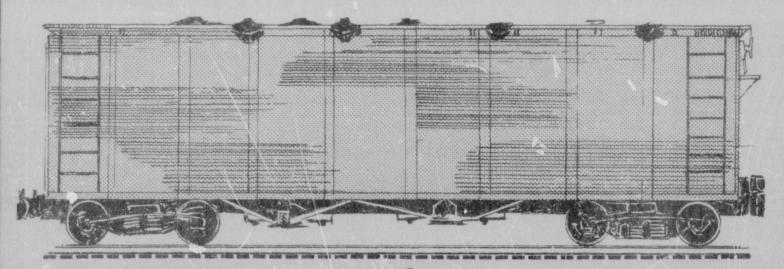

Washington, D.C. 20433, by March 31 of the year following that for which the report is made. Attention is specially directed to the following provisions of Part 1 of the Interstate Commerce Act

Sec. 20. (1) The Commission is beteby authorized to require annual, periodical, or special reports from carriers—essents. \* \* \* tas defined in this section) to prescribe the manner and force in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers, lessors, \* \* \* specific and full, true, and correct answers to all questions upon which the Commission may deem information to be necessary, classifying such carriers, lessors, \* \* \* as it may deem proper for any of these parposes. Such annual reports shall give an account of the affairs of the carrier, lessor, \* \* \* to such form and detail as may be prescribed by the Commission.

(2) Said annual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of twelve months ending on the 31st day of December in each year unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made out under oath and filed with the Commission at its office in We shington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time, be granted in any case by the Commission.

(7) (b). Any person who shall knowingly and willfully make, cause to be made, or participate in he making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be fried. " \* as shall knowingly or willfully fife with the Commission any false report or other document, shall be deemed guilty of a misdementar and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of art more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and improvement. \*\* \*

(7) (c) Any currier or lessor, \* \* \* or any officer, agont, employee, or representative thereof, who shall fail to make and file an annual or other report with the Commission within the time fixed by the Commission, or to make specific and full, true, and correct answer to any question within theirly days from the time it is lawfully required by the Commission so to do, shall forfeit to the United States the sum of one hundred dollars for each and every day it shall court are to be in default with respect therein.

(8). As used in this section " \* " the term "carrier" pleans a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier, and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water ties, or a pipe line, leased to and operated by a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor." " "

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts, immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See scheduled 108, page 3.

3. Every annual report should, in all particulars, be complete in itslif, and references to the returns of former years should not be made to take the place of required entries except as herein otherwise specifically directed or authorized.

4. If it be necessary or desirable to insert additional statements, typewritten or other, in a report, they should be legibly made on durable paper and, wherever practicable, on sheets not larger than a page of the Form. Inserted sheets should be securely attached preferably at the inner margin; attachment by pins or clips is insufficient.

5. All entries should be made in a nermanent black ink. Those of a contrary character should be indicated in parentheses. Items of an unusual character should be indicated by appropriate symbol and footnote.

6. Money items except averages, throughout the annual report form should be shown in WHOLE DOLLARS adjusted to accord with footi. s. Totals for amounts reported in subsidiary accounts included in supporting schedules must be in agreement with related primary accounts.

7. Each respondent should make its ennual report to this Commission in triplicate, retaining one copy in its files for reference in case correspondence with regard to such report becomes necessary. For this reason, three copies of the norm are sent to each corporation concerned.

8. Railroad corporations mainly distinguished as operating companies and lessor companies, are for the purpose of report to the Interstate Commerce Commission divided into classes. An operating company is one whose officers direct the business of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts, and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$5,000,000 at more. For this class, Annual Report Form R. L. is provided.

Class II compoures are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility cred, accounts in operating expenses, stall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as

Class S1 Exclusively switching. This class of companies included all those performing switching service only whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class \$2. Exclusively terminon. This class of companies includes all companies furnaling terminal stackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyers; etc. for which a charge is made, whether spectated for joint actions or for execute. In case a bridge or terry is a part of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be melatical under this condine.

Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a switching and a terminal serve e. This class of companies includes all companies whose operations cover both switching and reminal service, as defined above.

Class \$4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and service exclusively.

Class S3. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a retinual service, but which also conduct a reguler freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies are ade, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through moment of freight or pa senger traffic orner transportation operations, and operations other it a transportation operation.

f. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated:

COMMISSION means the Interstate Commerce Commission. RESPONDENT means the person or corporation in whose hehalf the report is made. THE YEAR means the year ended December 31 for which the report is made. THE CLOSE OF THE YEAR means the close of business on Devember 31 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the close of the period covered by the report. THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR means the beginning of business on January 1 of the year for which the report is made; or, in case the report is made for a shorter period than one year, it means the beginning of the period covered by the report. THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. THE UNIFORM System in Part 1001 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.
