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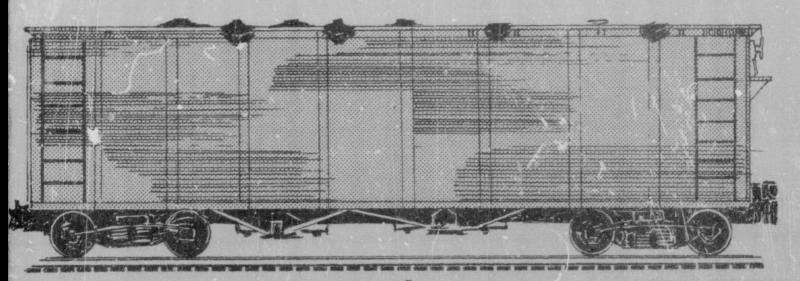

(2) Said unnual reports shall contain all the required information for the period of twelve months ending on the 31st day of December in each year, unless the Commission shall specify a different date, and shall be made out under oath and filed with the Commission at its office in Washington within three months after the close of the year for which report is made, unless additional time or granted in any case by the Commission.

(5) As used in this section "the term "carrier" means a common carrier subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such carrier; and the term "lessor" means a person owning a railroad, a water him, or a pipe line, lessed to and operated by a common carrie, subject to this part, and includes a receiver or trustee of such lessor.

The respondent is further required to send to the Bureau of Accounts immediately upon preparation, two copies of its latest annual report to stockholders. See schedule 108 page 6.

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general defini-

Class I companies are those having annual operating revenues of \$10,000,000. or more. For this class, Annual Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$10,000,000. For this class, Annual Report Form R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal compan / which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenant railroads, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

- Class S1. Exclusively switching. This class of companies includes all those performing switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue
- Class \$2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing terminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, etc., for which a charge is made, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a part of the facili ies operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this heading.
- Class S3. Both switching and terminal. Companies which perform both a witching and a terminal service. This class of companies is cludes all companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.
- Class S4. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are limited to bridges and ferries exclusively.
- Class S5. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal serv c, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include, in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger service, local freight service, participation in through anovement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.
- 8. Except where the context clearly indicates some other meaning, the following terms when used in this Form have the meanings below stated

THE PRECEDING YEAR means the year ended December 31 of the year next preceding the year for which the report is made. The Uniform System of ACCOUNTS FOR RALFOAD COMPANIES means the system of accounts in Part 1201 of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, as amended.
