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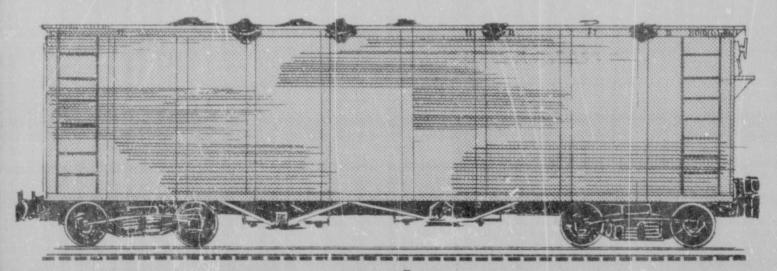

Any person who shall knowingly and wilfully make, cache to be made, or participate in the making of, any false entry in any annual or other report required under the section to be filed. * * * or shall knowingly or wilfully file with the Commission any false report or other documents, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than five thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment. ** *.

As operating company is one whose officers direct the bosiness of transportation and whose books contain operating as well as financial accounts, and, a lessor company, the property of which being leased to and operated by another company, is one that maintains a separate legal existence and keeps financial but not operating accounts. In making reports, lessor companies use Annual Report Form R-4

Operating companies (including switching and terminal) are broadly classified, with respect to their operating revenues, according to the following general definitions:

Class I companies are those having an anal operating revenues of \$5,000,000 or more For this class. Assent Report Form R-1 is provided.

Class II companies are those having annual operating revenues below \$5,000,000. For this class, Annual Report F am R-2 is provided.

In applying this classification to any switching or terminal company which is operated as a joint facility of owning or tenent railways, the sum of the annual railway operating revenues, the joint facility rent income, and the returns to joint facility credit accounts in operating expenses, shall be used in determining its class.

Switching and terminal companies are further classified as:

Class St. Exclusively witching. This class of companies includes all those performing witching service only, whether for man account or for revenue.

switching service only, whether for joint account or for revenue.

Class \$2. Exclusively terminal. This class of companies includes all companies furnishing reminal trackage or terminal facilities only, such as union passenger or freight stations, stockyards, erc. for which a charge is misde, whether operated for joint account or for revenue. In case a bridge or ferry is a pact of the facilities operated by a terminal company, it should be included under this head-ac-

Class S3. Both switching and reminal. Companies which perform he as a warching and a terminal service. This class of companies includes ail companies whose operations cover both switching and terminal service, as defined above.

Class S.I. Bridge and ferry. This class of companies is confined to those whose operations are finited to bridges and ferries exclusively.

Class SS. Mixed. Companies performing primarily a switching or a terminal service, but which also conduct a regular freight or passenger traffic. The revenues of this class of companies include in addition to switching or terminal revenues, those derived from local passenger review, local freight service, participation in through movement of freight or passenger traffic, other transportation operations, and operations other than transportation.

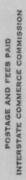
